The HHS Instructional Model is a tool used to evaluate classroom instruction, support teacher development, and align schoolwide practices.




Mathematics Results on iReady Diagnostic (7th and 8th Grades)

Comparison of Diagnostics 1 and 2 for the 2022-2023 School Year




Reading Results on iReady Diagnostic (7th and 8th Grades)

Comparison of Diagnostics 1 and 2 for the 2022-2023 School Year




ACT Aspire Percent Meets/Exceeds Standards by Subject Area (2016-2022)





ACT Aspire - All Grades: Percent Meets/Exceeds Standards - English



ACT Aspire - All Grades: Percent Meets/Exceeds Standards - Literacy




ACT Aspire Mean Value-Added Growth by Subject Area (2016-2022)






Total Number of Discipline Referrals vs. School Year

2021-2022 Total Student Composition by Race




