ACTION TEAMS FOR 2023-2024

Every staff member of HES serves on an Action Team (Click here for the list of Action Team Members for the current year). The facilitators of the Action Teams make up the Building Leadership Team. Our Action Team communication plan can be found here. Parents and Community Members serve on the following teams: Health and Wellness, Parent and Family Engagement, and Crisis Management. Occasionally, parents are called in to serve as a guest on the Building Leadership Team. Academic programs are discussed, analyzed, and updated with parents and community members in the Parent and Family Engagement Action Team. Each action team identifies specific areas of focus for their team in the school improvement action plan (see below). The facilitators serve on the Building Leadership Team and adjustments are made accordingly. The action teams also keep their minutes, agendas, and sign-in sheets in a shared Google folder, so they may be accessed by all faculty and staff for transparency. We do not share these with non-school personnel due to privacy concerns.

The Literacy and Math Action Teams are instructed to operate under the four guiding questions of a PLC:

- 1. What do students know, need to be able to understand, and do? curriculum, concepts, standards, knowledge, skills, performance.
- 2. How will we know if they have learned it? assessments, proficiency, evidence, rubrics, grading practices
- 3. What will we do if a student has difficulty learning it? Response to Intervention Plan: interventions, re-teaching, grouping, engagement, monitoring plan
- 4. What will we do if a student already knows it? extension, individualization, project-based learning, gifted and talented possible






ACT Aspire Trend Data 2016-2023



INSTRUCTIONAL PRACTICE DATA REVIEW

Hermitage Elementary School has an instructional model created and adapted by the HES faculty on August 7, 2019, and it is updated annually. Click here to see the <u>HES Instructional Model</u>. The model was developed using the book *Leading A High Reliability School* by Robert J. Marzano, Philip B. Warrick, Cameron L. Rains, and Richard DuFour along with the vision, mission, and core beliefs of Hermitage Elementary School. Observations conducted by the building principal and Peer-to-Peer observations are based on the HES Instructional Model. Professional

development is provided in various ways, sometimes by others in the building, in areas of concern for individuals, teams of teachers, and the whole school.

At the end of the 2021-2022 school year, the following areas were identified as weak points in the school as a whole during observations on the instructional model:

- Using Questioning and Discussion Techniques (3b) Use of multiple types of questions, prompts for elaboration
- Communication of High Expectations to All Students (3a)

Each educator at HES works with the principal to develop Professional Growth Goals based on their observational data, individual reflection, student achievement data, and discipline data.

CURRICULUM DATA REVIEW

Hermitage Elementary School identified essential standards, created learning targets, paced learning in a pacing guide, and developed common assessments in 2018-2019. Those were minimally updated each year following the creation. After being trained in the Science of Reading and growing in our understanding of standards, targets, and common assessments, the instructional action teams at HES decided that it was time to take a deep analytical look at the essential standards, learning targets, pacing guides, and common assessments. During the 2021-2022 school year, the math action team and literacy action team began this work. As a school, we have a two year goal to complete this work.

The district purchased DESE approved reading curriculum for Tier 1, Tier 2, and Tier 3 instruction in the summer of 2021 due to the little to no movement in literacy scores from 2019 and the need to ensure curriculum matches the Science of Reading. As you can see from the chart below, the district and Hermitage Elementary School lacked approved curriculum in several of the "Big 5" areas as well as writing and grammar. This analysis was done in the spring of 2021 by the literacy team for the district.

Key: Blue indicates no curriculum at all for Tier 1. Red indicates a partially approved program from DESE. White indicates approval from DESE or no need for approval. Black indicates there is no need for an approved curriculum in that area for that grade level.
