FALL 2022 ATHLETIC INFORMATION

ALL FALL SPORTS START: MONDAY, AUGUST 8, 2022

Fall Sport Offerings: Cheerleading, Boys and Girls Cross Country, Dance, Field Hockey, Football, Boys and Girls Golf, Boys Soccer, Girls Tennis, and Girls Volleyball.

Find tryout/practice times on the Athletic webpage.

Athletic Registration: Athletes will not be allowed to try out or practice until a parent/guardian has completed the online registration through rSchool.

Go to https://dl17-ar.rschooltoday.com/ and select athletic registration for Antioch Community. All parents registering a student-athlete for sports must be aware that the registration process does not reach its full completion until school registration & residency check have been completed and a current physical that covers the athlete through their entire season has been turned-in to the ACHS main office. Additionally, sophomores, juniors and seniors must have passed a total of five classes the previous spring and summer sessions and have NO OUTSTANDING PAST FEES OF ANY KIND, unless a payment plan has been developed and agreed upon.

The freshman physical form with immunization record (required of all freshman), the IHSA sports physical form (required of all sophomore, junior and senior athletes) are available as part of the athletic registration process or in the main office. Original physicals must be on file at ACHS. Freshmen should make a copy of their school physical to bring into the main office. Physicals submitted from the middle school may not be easily accessed until the school year begins, which could result in a delay in athletic participation.

MANDATORY Athlete/Parent/Coaches Meeting: On Tuesday, August 9, 2022, there will be an Athletic Informational night starting promptly at 7:00 pm in the District 117 Field House. All parents, athletes and coaches from ALL sports (fall, winter and spring seasons) are asked to be in attendance. Following the informational meeting, fall sports will hold specific parent meetings at various locations throughout the school.

2022-2023 Athletic Fees: Community High School District #117 has an athletic participation fee of \$150 per sport with a cap of \$300 for individuals and a \$450 cap for families. Fall athletic fees are due by September 9, 2022. The Athletic Fee form is available on the Athletic website and should accompany all payments. Athletic fees may be paid in the main office or through the Vanco Portal once rosters are set. Athletic fee payments will not be processed through the online registration program.

Fall Sports Pictures: Fall sports pictures will be taken on Thursday, August 25, starting at 3:30 pm. Pictures will be available online to order.

Freshman Orientation –August 11 from 8:00 to 10:30 am (check-in will begin at 7:45). Bus transportation will be provided and attendance is *strongly* encouraged for all freshmen. Details will be mailed separately.

New Student Orientation Day - August 11 from 12:00-1:00. Transportation needs to be arranged independently. Sophomores, juniors and seniors new to ACHS are invited to attend.

The Medical Compliance Deadline for 2022-2023 is the first day of School; August 17 for Grade 9, and August 18 for Grades 10-12.

Medical Compliance Deadline for the 2022-2023 School Year:

Freshman must have a completed physical exam on the State of Illinois Certificate of Child Health Examination form, dated within 12 months from the 1st day of school. This is the only acceptable form. All required immunizations must be up-to-date and properly documented. *All required documents need to be turned in by the first day of school, August 17.* In addition to the above requirements, incoming 9th graders must also provide documentation of a current dental exam. The dental exam documentation must be dated between November 2021 and the due date of May 15, 2023.

Seniors 12th Grade requirement: meningococcal (MCV4) vaccine (2 doses [2nd dose after the 16th birthday], or 1 dose after the 16th birthday).



Privacy Act Statement: This explains how we will use the information you give us. The Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act requires the information on this application. You do not have to give the information, but if you do not, we cannot approve your child for free or reduced price meals. You must include the last four digits of the social security number of the adult household member who signs the application. The last four digits of the social security number is not required when you apply on behalf of a foster child or you list a Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) Program or Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR) case number or other FDPIR identifier for your child or when you indicate that the adult household member signing the application does not have a social security number. We will use your information to determine if your child is eligible for free or reduced price meals, and for administration and enforcement of the lunch and breakfast programs. We MAY share your eligibility information with education, health, and nutrition programs to help them evaluate, fund, or determine benefits for their programs, auditors for program reviews, and law enforcement officials to help them look into violations of program rules.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTION

- DO I NEED TO FILL OUT AN APPLICATION FOR EACH CHILD? No. Complete the application to apply for free
 or reduced price meals. Use one Household Eligibility Application for all students in your household per district.
 We cannot approve an application that is not complete, so be sure to fill out all required information. Return the
 completed application to the school.
- 2. WHO CAN GET FREE MEALS? All children in households receiving benefits from Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) and/or are foster children that are under the legal responsibility of a foster care agency or court are eligible for free meals regardless of your income. Also, your children can get free meals if your household's gross income is within the free limits on the Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines. Children who meet the definition of homeless, runaway, or migrant also qualify for free meals.
- 3. A MEMBER OF MY HOUSEHOLD RECEIVED SNAP OR TANF BENEFITS. THE <u>GRADE</u> SCHOOL SENT A LETTER STATING THAT MY CHILD IS AUTOMATICALLY APPROVED FOR FREE MEALS BASED ON DIRECT CERTIFICATION. <u>DO I NEED TO DO ANYTHING MORE TO ENSURE THAT MY HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT RECEIVES FREE MEALS?</u> YES. Complete the application to apply for free or reduced price meals. Use one Household Eligibility Application for all students in your household per district. We cannot approve an application that is not complete, so be sure to fill out all required information. Return the completed application to the school.
- 4. HOW DO I KNOW IF MY CHILDREN QUALIFY AS HOMELESS, MIGRANT, OR RUNAWAY? Do the members of your household lack a permanent address? Are you staying together in a shelter, hotel, or other temporary housing arrangement? Are any children living with you who have chosen to leave their prior family or household? If you believe children in your household meet these descriptions and haven't been told your children will get free meals, please contact your school.
- 5. MY CHILD'S APPLICATION WAS APPROVED LAST YEAR. DO I NEED TO FILL OUT ANOTHER ONE? Yes. Your child's application is only good for that school year and for the first few days of this school year. You must send in a new application unless the school told you that your child is eligible for the new school year.
- 6. I GET WIC. CAN MY CHILD(REN) GET FREE MEALS? Children in households participating in WIC <u>may</u> be eligible for free meals. Please fill out the enclosed application and include the proper documentation as stated in the cover letter.
- 7. WILL THE INFORMATION I GIVE BE CHECKED? Yes. We may also ask you to send written proof.
- 8. **IF I DON'T QUALIFY NOW, MAY I APPLY LATER? Yes**, you may apply at any time during the school year. For example, children with a parent or guardian who becomes unemployed may become eligible for free meals if the household income drops below the income limit.
- 9. WHAT IF I DISAGREE WITH THE SCHOOL'S DECISION ABOUT MY APPLICATION? You should contact your school's fees secretary for a complete understanding.
- 10. MAY I APPLY IF SOMEONE IN MY HOUSEHOLD IS NOT A U.S. CITIZEN? Yes. You or your child(ren) do not have to be U.S. citizens to qualify for free or reduced price meals.
- 11. WHO SHOULD I INCLUDE AS MEMBERS OF MY HOUSEHOLD? You must include all people living in your household, related or not (such as grandparents, other relatives, or friends) who share income and expenses. You must include yourself and all children living with you. If you live with other people who are economically independent (for example, people who you do not support, who do not share income with you or your children, and who pay a prorated share of expenses), do not include them.
- 12. WHAT IF MY INCOME IS NOT ALWAYS THE SAME? List the annual gross income and you must include the first page of your income tax return. If you have lost a job or had your hours or wages reduced, use your current income and include your two most recent paystubs or unemployment records.
- 13. WHAT IF SOME HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS HAVE NO INCOME TO REPORT? Whenever this happens, please write a 0 in the field. Please be careful when leaving income fields blank, this could delay the approval process.
 - 14. **WE ARE IN THE MILITARY. DO WE REPORT OUR INCOME DIFFERENTLY?** If you are on active duty, you must provide a dependent ID card for each student. All other military must complete the application process in full.
- 15. MY FAMILY NEEDS MORE HELP. ARE THERE OTHER PROGRAMS WE MIGHT APPLY FOR? To find out how to apply for SNAP, TANF or other assistance benefits, contact your local Department of Human Services office or call (800) 843-6154 (voice) or (800) 447-6404 (TTY).
