### Congratulations to the 2014 Selkirk Educator of the Year

During an elementary student assembly on the day before school was out in June, Selkirk Superintendent Nancy Lotze announced the Selkirk Board of Directors selected school psychologist, Jane Reed, as the 2014 Educator of the Year. Mrs. Reed began working in the Selkirk School District in 1984 as a Speech Therapist, although for the first three years she was an ESD 101 employee. She continued working as a speech therapist but expanded her repertoire to include Communication Lab and Second Step programs delivered in a classroom setting and designed to help students make better choices. In 2006, Reed completed her school psychologist certification and added that to her list of roles in the school district.

Mrs. Reed is not a typical school psychologist whose interactions with students might be limited only to assessments or special education issues. She also spends a large portion of her school day working directly with students one-to-one or in small groups to help them learn how to make better choices or deal with issues, both school and home-related. Mrs. Reed teaches students that they have the ability to change their behavior, manage stress, make better choices...she empowers them and the students are stronger and more confident because of that experience.

Mrs. Reed described by those who work with her as a person who forms very positive and supportive relationships with students with the goal of helping them get through whatever challenges they face. Mrs. Reed makes a difference in the lives of so many children and we are fortunate that she chooses to work at Selkirk!

can just leave you with the tune bouncing around in your head while I go on to share some of the scrubbing and painting, and pounding, and maintaining that we've done over the summer.

While we are not in Kansas or the 1930's, our main buildings were built before Technicolor was available in the home. For those of you born prior to 1985, that means when the buildings were built in the 1940's, (*elementary gym*) 50's (*elementary school*) and early 60's (*high school*) black and white television was all that was available and only four television channels (NBC, ABC, CBS, and PBS). Each year our summer cleaning crew (shown right) headed by Cathy Enyeart does an amazing job cleaning, shampooing, waxing and shining everything from windows to walls and desks to fixtures. Many of these floor coverings, hardware, and even desks are original equipment. This year's summer crew, incidentally made up of entirely of Selkirk alumni all with respectable height (so not a munchkin in the bunch), spent five furious

and intense weeks preparing our facility for fall. These buildings are old and this crew definitely worked their magic to make sure we have a clean, healthy environment for our students!

There are many, many items in need of repair or updating and a few years ago we were fortunate enough to work with the Pend Oreille County Commissioners to renegotiate the terms of our portion of the Seattle City Light impact payments. By the end of 2015, we will have about 2 million dollars in our Capital Projects Fund waiting for a community-assisted facilities group to help us make some long-term plans about consolidating or trying to maintain two separate and aging sites. If you are interested in that discussion, please let me know.

We did use about \$100,000 of that money this summer to fix a few of the more pressing problems. We removed broken cement that was causing tripping and other safety hazards using Versatile Industries. We did not replace all cement areas, just a few. Dawson Construction added some pea gravel to the playground for safety and took out broken side walks and blacktop on the elementary playground which was replaced with gravel. While we needed to remove the safety hazard, gravel was a cheaper option than cement. Until we make long-range plans for our buildings the goal is to keep costs down while fixing the most pressing issues.

Our elementary gym roof was also due for replacement as it was 25 plus years old, so before we experienced more leaks, JU Roofing (the same company that roofed the high school last summer) was contracted. At the same time they helped us fashion a solution for the high school gym walls above the roof line. The masonry was so old that when snow piled against them there were leaks down the walls and into the interior gym walls. That has now been repaired. You may notice the green metal roofing material high up on either side of the high school gym.

Finally, keep your eye out this month for a building of a different color (as opposed to the proverbial horse of a different color seen by Dorothy in Oz). The high school envelope was in need of repair and patching as the walls are crumbling in places. We found a company to help with the more pressing repairs and will paint the building when completed so our high school does not look like an old dappled mare. We hope you like our bold new color scheme of light gray (for the main building) with forest green and white accents!

These updates along with our summer cleaning and regular scheduled maintenance (including new library and entry carpet at the high school, bathroom stall replacement in most of the high school), and freshly waxed floors, will give our building that fresh look for the start of the school year. Can I get a "Tra, la, la, la, la la...in the merry old land of...."?! O.k. Maybe that still needs work.

**Educator Standards and Qualifications**  
No Child Left Behind (NCLB) places an emphasis on parents’ right to know about the professional qualifications of their child’s classroom teachers. Such information would relate to the type of Washington Sate Certificate held, areas of endorsement, college major and advanced degrees. In addition, all Title 1 schools must notify parents individually when their child had been assigned to or has been taught for four or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who does not meet NCLB requirements. Selkirk Elementary School operates a Title 1 school-wide program. All Selkirk Elementary teachers and paraeducators currently meet the highly qualified definitions set by NCLB. **McKinney/Vento Act**  
The McKinney-Vento Act is a federal law that makes sure children and youth who do not have permanent housing can go to school, get transportation to school, and gives these children access to the school lunch program. **Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act for Elementary and Secondary Schools**  
The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords parents and students over 18 years of age (“eligible students”) certain rights with respect to the student’s education records. These rights are: (1) The right to inspect and review the student’s education records within 45 days of the day the School receives a request for access. Parents or eligible students should submit to the School principal [or appropriate school official] a written request that identifies the record(s) they wish to inspect. The School official will make arrangements for access and notify the parent or eligible student of the time and place where the records may be inspected. (2) The right to request the amendment of the student’s education records that the parent or eligible student believes are inaccurate or misleading. Parents or eligible students may ask the School to amend a record that they believe is inaccurate or misleading. They should write the School principal [or appropriate official], clearly identify the part of the record they want changed, and specify why it is inaccurate or misleading. If the School decides not to amend the record as requested by the parent or eligible student, the School will notify the parent or eligible student of the decision and advise them of their right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to the parent or eligible student when notified of the right to a hearing. (3) The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student’s education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent. One exception, which permits disclosure without consent, is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests. A school official is a person employed by the School as an administrator, supervisor, instructor, or support staff member (including health or medical staff and law enforcement unit personnel); a person serving on the School Board; a person or company with whom the School has contracted to perform a special task (such as an attorney, auditor, medical consultant, or therapist); or a parent or student serving on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or assisting another school official in performing his or her tasks. A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility. [Optional] Upon request, the School discloses education records without consent to officials of another school district in which a student seeks or intends to enroll. [NOTE: FERPA requires a school district to make a reasonable attempt to notify the parent or eligible student of the records request unless it states in its annual notification that it intends to forward records on request.] (4) The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the School to comply with the requirements of FERPA. The name and address of the Office that administers FERPA are: Family Policy Compliance Office U.S. Department of Education 400 Maryland Avenue, SW Washington, DC 20202-5901  
\*State Law Qualification: Although FERPA allows 45 days to honor a request, the state policy records law requires an appropriate response to a “public records” request within five business days.  
RCW 42.17.320

Pesticide Notification, Posting, and Record Keeping

The Selkirk School District Board of Directors’ Policy # 6985 governs the use of pesticides on school grounds and in school facilities for the following pests: bees, wasps, hornets, ants, lice, weeds, and rodents.  
Notification of use of pesticides will be posted for 24 hours after use of the application and 48 hours prior to the application. However, if the site is unoccupied by students and staff for two consecutive days after application, then pre-notification will not be made. All notifications will contain the following information:  
Product name  
Date & Time of application  
Location where applied  
Pest to be controlled  
Contact information  
Notifications will be placed in the main office of each building where the application occurred. The district will also maintain a registry of interested persons wishing to be notified by email of pesticide applications. Please contact the district office at the number below if you wish to be included on the registry.

2014 Annual Public Notice Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA)

In compliance with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Asbestos Hazard Emergency Act (AHERA), Selkirk School District contracted with Educational Service District 101 of Spokane, Washington to conduct the Three-Year Asbestos Reinspection of all school buildings. During July 2013, an EPA accredited asbestos Inspector and Management Planner performed the required inspection, reassessed each category of asbestos containing building materials (ACBM) and noted any significant changes from the 1989, 1992, 1995, 1998, 2001, 2004, 2007 and 2010 inspections. Reinspection will assist the school district in the process of safely managing each ACBM within our district. As result of the 2013 AHERA 3-year reinspection the following known or assumed asbestos containing building materials (ACBMs) have been identified in the following buildings. All ACBM listed below were found to be in good condition and are being continually maintained in accordance with all Washington State and Federal laws.

Important Reminders

Bus Stops

Students need to be at the bus stop 5 to 10 minutes before the scheduled time of arrival of the bus.  
Our regular bus routes only travel on State and county roads. Special services and mid-day buses will travel into private driveways as long as the driveway is in good condition with adequate room for a small bus to turn around.

Home-based Instruction Information

Parents who intend to provide home-based instruction in lieu of attendance or enrollment in a public school, approved private school, or an extension program of an approved private school must file an annual declaration of intent to provide home-based instruction by September 15th. Any homeschool student who wishes to participate in athletics must be verified against the roster. Forms are available at the Selkirk District Office located in the Selkirk Elementary School (509) 446-2951.

Why Fill Out A Meal Application?

Selkirk School District qualifies for different funding programs and grants based on the number of eligible free and reduced lunch applications on file. If you feel that your household qualifies for free or reduced meals, please fill out an application and submit it to your child’s school. Even if you do not wish to take advantage of the meal benefits, you’ll be helping our schools. Thank you!

Optional Student Insurance

Optional student insurance is available for all students, K-12, for school time coverage or 24 hour coverage. Because of the complexity of these policies, please check with the building secretaries for particular details on coverages and rates.  
**NOTE:** All student athletes must have either a family policy that meets WIAA requirements for competitive sports or student insurance through the school district.

Account set-up is quick and in minutes you will have access to your child's attendance information and meal account data. ## Thanks to NPOV Lions...Science on Wheels Visits

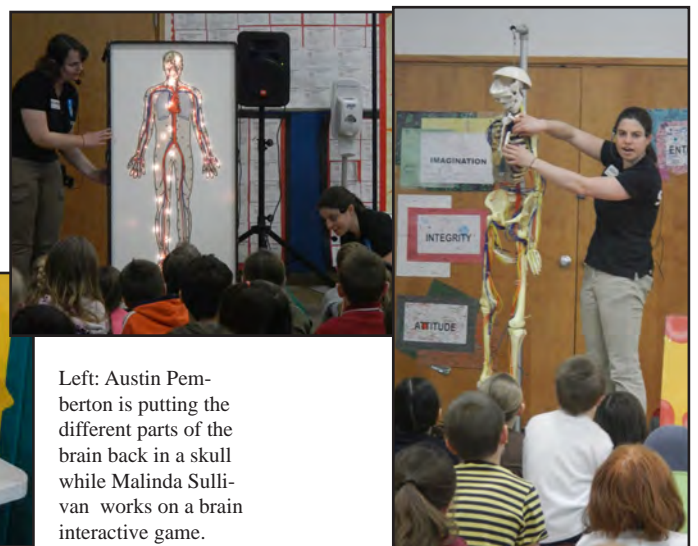

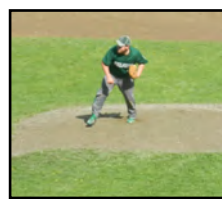

Letter to Parents/

with Health Conditions

If your child has a health condition or is taking any medications during the school hours, whether the medicines are prescribed or “as needed” (i.e. on an emergency basis or just for headaches, etc.), Nancy Kiss, School Nurse, needs to have a health plan and/or Doctor’s order on file at the school. She sent home information in June to parents of children that may have had a Health Plan or were taking medications during the past school year so these children will have their health needs on record and have the required paperwork in place the day they start school in September.

If you are new to our school district or your child has a new health concern please contact the school or Mrs. Kiss to find out which forms are needed. Doctor’s offices have these forms and most are aware that they need to fill them out for the child to have medication at school. They need to be filled out by both your child’s doctor and you, the parent/guardian. Students in grades K-5 may not carry medication in their backpacks. Students in grades 6-8 may only carry over-the-counter medication in backpacks and it must be recorded in the office.

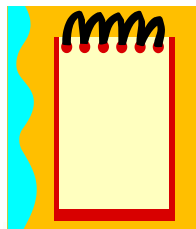
