Reopening Plan

On June 30, Governor Gretchen Whitmer released requirements and recommendations to safely bring students back to classrooms for in-person instruction for the 2020-2021 school year. Safety is always our priority. The Parchment School District will follow the requirements by providing families two learning options for the fall; in-person instruction on campus at our PSD facilities or full-time virtual curriculum as Parchment students through KVIC online program. Cleaning Procedures



- Frequent hand washing by students, staff & custodial team
- High contact areas and surfaces cleaned frequently
- Use of approved disinfectants
- Hand sanitizer stations in common areas & classrooms

Transportation



- Hand sanitizer required to enter bus
- Masks required to enter bus
- Assigned Seats
- Arrival and dismissal times staggered
- Disinfected between routes

Cafeteria/Common Areas



- Breakfast & Lunch in classroom K-5
- Food distribution for online option
- One way traffic in hallways
- Social distancing signage

Masks



- Staff and students must follow face coverings order per the requirements in MI Safe Schools Return to School Roadmap Guidance. See below:
- All staff must wear face coverings at all times
- PreK-12 students & staff in hallways and common areas. 6-12 required at all times except eating and drinking.
- K-5 wear masks in all areas with designated breaks when distanced closest to 6ft as possible

Preventative Mitigation



- Self-assessment of symptoms daily at home by students and staff.
- Staff complete COVID19 daily survey
- Limit building access for visitors/volunteers
- Consistent return to school procedures for students and staff
- Deep sanitation day-Wednesdays
