

Riverside Ward Changes from the Election

The Riverside Board of Education is currently composed of two wards: Ward 1 is made up of representation from the original Cedar Rapids school district with 5 members. Ward 2 representation includes 4 members from the original Spalding Public school district.

This past November, on election day, voters at the polls approved the removal of wards within the Riverside district. This will take effect at the 2024 election. At that time, Riverside district will be one district where all registered voters can vote for all board member openings, not just those from their ward. This also means, starting in 2024, anyone from the entire district can run for the board of education. You no longer have to run for a board seat in the ward where you reside.

Riverside Committees

To stay in compliance with Rule 10 all public schools must have a variety of committees that serve the school. These committees meet regularly and help to maintain a safe and orderly school that follows the rules and regulations set forth by the Nebraska Department of Education and the Federal Government. To be in compliance each school must have a Continuous School Improvement Team (CIP), Safety Team, Crisis Team, Wellness Committee, Threat Assessment Team, and an American Civics Committee. These different committees are designated to focus on different facets of our school system, but ultimately work together to provide a safe and educational environment for all our stakeholders.

The Continuous Improvement Team is the steering committee in the school improvement process. This committee guides the planning, implementation, evaluation, and renewal of continuous school improvement activities to meet local and state goals and priorities. The main goal of the process is to improve student learning. It is a continuous process that encompasses the idea that improvement does not have a starting and stopping point, but is ongoing. The process is looked at every five years by an external team that reviews the progress and provides written recommendations.

Safety and Security Team: The Riverside School Safety and Security Committee includes representatives of staff, parents, and the community. The committee meets at a minimum annually to prepare and/or review safety and security plans and procedures, including emergency plans and procedures. The four standards of the Safety and Security team are as follows:

- 1) Prevention: Aimed at preventing incidents
- 2) Preparedness: Targeted at limiting incident casualties, destruction, and chaos
- 3) Response: Intended planning to respond to an incident
- 4) Recovery: Designed actions to return the climate

Threat Assessment Team: The Riverside Public Schools Threat Assessment team promotes a safe school environment that focuses on the prevention of concerning situations to maximize the safety of our school. The Threat Assessment Team evaluates whether situations or behaviors are a threat to the safety of individuals or the school. The team determines if those behaviors exhibited are concerning and of low, moderate, or high concern of targeted violence occurring toward others or oneself. Threat Assessment is a key preventive measure to assess the credibility of a threat and manage that threat.

Crisis Team: The Riverside Public School's Crisis Team is responsible for implementing the response plan at the time of a crisis. The Crisis Team communicates and manages a crisis situation, as well as, implements recovery plans post-crisis.

Wellness Committee: The Wellness Committee is staff, board, and community members. The committee meets annually to discuss compliance with the local wellness policy. The committee focuses on creating an educational environment that promotes the physical and mental health and wellness of all stakeholders.

The Committee on American Civics: The Riverside Committee of American Civics is staff and board members and work together to promote the teaching of American History and Government in school. They hold no fewer than two public meetings annually, at least one when public testimony is accepted, and work at making sure our school system is meeting the statutory responsibilities of Nebraska School Law 79-724.

Social/Emotional/Behavioral/Learning (SEBL) Committee: The Riverside Public Schools SEBL Committee is composed of trained teachers that promote building knowledge, capacity, and increased support for SEBL/Mental Health supports for staff and students. They promote and implement resources to promote a positive school climate and student/staff well-being.

Data

The 2021-2022 Nebraska Department of Education state data has been released and *Nebraska scored well*, especially when compared to other states. These results are a testament to the dedication and perseverance of our educators, students, and families. No other state scored higher than Nebraska in fourth-grade math. Only one state scored higher in eighth-grade math. Only three states outscored Nebraska in fourth-grade reading and only seven states scored higher in eighth-grade reading. On a local level, Riverside received great news about student achievement growth during the 2021-22 school year in the most recent assessment ratings released from the state last week.

Nebraska students in grades 3-8 and 11 were tested using the Nebraska Student-Centered Assessment System (NSCAS) in English Language Arts and Math. Three levels of proficiency were determined for each student in grades 3-8 and 11 based on test performance: Developing, On Track, and Advanced. The percentage of overall proficiency in meeting state standards was calculated based on the scores of students achieving the "On Track" and "Advanced" levels. Riverside's results are as follows:

Nebraska's purpose of statewide annual assessments continues to provide comparable data to identify outcome gaps; empower educators, parents, and families with data to inform education planning and decision-making; help evaluate academic programs across districts and schools; and prioritize additional funds, resources, and supports to the schools, educators, and students who need them most.

We are beyond excited that our Riverside students are rated well above the state average in all tested content areas of math, science, and English Language Arts. We will celebrate our success and continue striving for growth from all our students and staff. 
