HIGH SCHOOL COUNSELING NEWS

FIRST AND FOREMOST...

Welcome back to the second semester! I am happy to say, schedule changes have been finalized and high school courses are diving right into their perspective curriculum.

Dual and College Credit Students have all started their online college courses through Wayne State College and Central Community College. Riverside High School currently has 13 juniors/seniors enrolled in 22 various online college courses for the Spring Semester!

If you are a student taking college level courses make sure you visit with Ms. Choyeski to discuss eligibility for the ACE Scholarship and then get that submitted ASAP.

Wayne State College will have student billing posted on Feb. 3. Students will be emailed a bill to their WSC email account with a paper invoice mailed later. Students can pay online at their Wildcats Online account with a credit card, or they can mail a check to WSC, Student Financial Services, Hahn Administration, Room 104, 1111 Main St., Wayne, NE 68787.

Central Community College bills are due within 30 days of courses starting or a \$50 late charge will be added to all unpaid accounts. Students can pay by credit card by logging into WebCentral or they can mail a check to Student Accounts Office, P.O. Box 1027 Columbus | NE, 68602. Please put the student ID number and last name in the subject of the check.

JUNIORS-

Every year, Riverside High School Juniors are permitted 2 college visits during the school year, that doesn't count against attendance. I encourage parents to discuss college planning with your Junior students to see what colleges they are interested in, and start planning a few visits to a college campus this spring. College visits allow the students to tour campus, talk to professors and/or students in their field of interests, and see what college life is like on that campus.

SENIORS -

Every year Seniors are permitted 3 college visits during the school year. This fall and winter our seniors have been busy with college visits, college research, college applications, filling out the FAFSA, and starting on scholarships. Please continue these college visits throughout the spring. We are also just getting started diving into local scholarship with applications. Prepare your resumes, transcripts. and letters recommendations now. Scholarship deadlines will start coming up quickly!

FAFSA — The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) opened for seniors/parents on October 1. Getting this completed is critically important as it affects scholarships as well as grants. All families are welcome to contact EducationQuest in Lincoln, Kearney or Omaha to schedule an appt. (virtual appts are welcome) for FREE assistance with completing this application. They are extremely knowledgeable and helpful ... and it truly is free assistance!



OUR MISSION

Provide opportunities that inspire students to prepare, progress, and positively contribute to our global world.

Riverside Public Schools was created on August 1, 2014, as a result of a merger of the Cedar Rapids and Spalding Public School Districts. The Riverside District encompasses the communities of Spalding, Primrose, Cedar Rapids, and areas of Belgrade--approximately 273 square miles. Both Spalding and Cedar Rapids facilities house PK-5 students. Spalding is also home to all 6-8 middle-grade students, while the district's 9-12 students all attend at the Cedar Rapids site. All 3-12 students are 1:1 with Chromebooks and the district promotes 21st Century learning through technology integration.

Many of our graduates leave school with college credit hours with dual credit class offerings. Students at Riverside enjoy a variety of extra-curricular activities where 90% of our high school students participate in at least one organization or activity.

Board of Education

This past November, on election day, voters at the polls approved the removal of wards within the Riverside district. This will take effect at the 2024 election. At that time, Riverside district will be one district where all registered voters can vote for all board member openings, not just those from their ward. This also means, starting in 2024, anyone from the entire district can run for the board of education. You no longer have to run for a board seat in the ward where you reside.

NSCAS 2021-22 Assessments

Nebraska students in grades 3-8 and 11 were tested using the Nebraska Student-Centered Assessment System (NSCAS) in English Language Arts and Math. Three levels of proficiency were determined for each student in grades 3-8 and 11 based on test performance: Developing, On Track, and Advanced. The percentage of overall proficiency in meeting state standards was calculated based on the scores of students achieving the "On Track" and
