RESOLUTION NO. 2020-21-01

RESOLUTION INSTITUTING DISTANCE LEARNING INSTRUCTION FOR THE BEGINNING OF THE 2020-2021 SCHOOL YEAR

WHEREAS, due to the COVID-19 public health emergency, on March 16, 2020, all District schools were closed to students, and instruction was provided through distance learning for the remainder of the 2019-2020 school year; and

WHEREAS, on June 29, 2020, Governor Newsom signed into law Senate Bill 98, the education omnibus trailer bill to the 2020 Budget Act, adding sections to the Education Code related to distance learning for the 2020-2021 school year; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Code sections 43502 and 43504, the Gustine Unified School District ("District") is required to offer students in-person instruction "to the greatest extent possible" and may offer distance learning; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Code section 43503, the District is authorized to provide distance learning: (1) as a result of an order or guidance from a state public health officer or a local public health officer; and/or (2) for students who are "medically fragile," "would be put at risk," or are self-quarantining; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Code section 43509, the Board is required to adopt, by September 30, 2020, a "Learning Continuity and Attendance Plan," to address, among other matters, how the District will provide continuity of learning during the 2020-2021 school year through in-person instructional offerings and plans for a distance learning program; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the California Department of Public Health's "COVID-19 and Reopening In-Person Learning Framework for K-12 Schools in California, 2020-2021 School Year" (July 17, 2020) (the "CDPH Reopening Framework"), a school district that is in a county on the State of California's county monitoring list for COVID-19 may not reopen for in-person instruction until the county in which it is located has been off of the county monitoring list for at least fourteen (14) consecutive days, unless a waiver has been granted by the local health officer for elementary schools to open for in-person instruction; and

WHEREAS, effective as of the date of this Resolution, the County of Merced is on the county monitoring list; and

WHEREAS, the District acknowledges and recognizes the need to protect its pupils who are medically fragile, "put at risk" by in-person instruction, or who are self-quarantining because of exposure to COVID-19; and

- **WHEREAS**, August 19, 2020, is the first scheduled day of instruction for the 2020-2021 school year; and
- WHEREAS, the CDPH "COVID-19 Industry Guidance: Schools and School-Based Programs" (July 17, 2020) suggests that districts "maximize space between seating and desks" and "consider ways to establish separation of students," including, as one option, "six feet between [student] desks"; and
- WHEREAS, the District cannot accommodate 6 foot in-class social distancing without substantially reducing the number of students physically in each class at any given time, which, as a practical matter, necessitates that the District incorporate a hybrid and/or distance learning instructional model if and when District schools are permitted to reopen for in-person instruction consistent with the CDPH Reopening Framework; and
- WHEREAS, as a result of the CDPH Reopening Framework, and based on current local public health conditions, the Board does not at this time anticipate that it will be possible to offer students in-person instruction at the beginning of the 2020-2021 school year, and therefore deems it prudent at this time for the District to plan for the 2020-2021 school year to begin with all instruction in distance learning mode, with inperson instruction to be offered as public health conditions may allow, consistent with the CDPH Reopening Framework.
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Trustees of the Gustine Unified School District that District will be prepared to offer a compliant distance learning or independent study program when school resumes and throughout the 2020-21 school year.
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that distance learning shall comply with all applicable requirements of Education Code sections 43502, 43503 and 43504, including, but not limited to, daily live interaction between teachers and students, and access for all pupils to connectivity and devices adequate to participate in the educational program and complete assigned work.
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that in-person instruction shall be offered as public health conditions may allow, consistent with the CDPH Reopening Framework (i.e., after the County of Merced has been removed from the county monitoring list for at least fourteen consecutive days), and other applicable public health orders and guidance, as determined by the Superintendent.
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Board may revisit its determination as set forth in this Resolution as changing public health conditions may warrant, and in any event this Resolution shall not preempt or predetermine the content of the Learning Continuity and Attendance Plan to be adopted by September 30, 2020, pursuant to Education Code section 43509.

Grades/Evaluation Of Student Achievement

BP 5121 **Students**

The Governing Board believes that grades serve a valuable instructional purpose by helping students and parents/guardians understand performance expectations and identifying the student's areas of strength and those areas needing improvement. Parents/guardians and students have the right to receive course grades that represent an accurate evaluation of the student's achievement.

(cf. 5020 - Parent Rights and Responsibilities) (cf. 5125.2 - Withholding Grades, Diploma or Transcripts)

The Superintendent or designee shall establish a uniform grading system based on standards that apply to all students in that course and grade level. Principals and teachers shall ensure that student grades conform to this system. Teachers shall inform students and parents/guardians how student achievement will be evaluated in the classroom.

A teacher shall base a student's grades on impartial, consistent observation of the quality of the student's work and his/her mastery of course content and district standards. Students shall have the opportunity to demonstrate this mastery through a variety of methods such as classroom participation, homework, tests, and portfolios.

The teacher of each course shall determine the student's grade. The grade assigned by the teacher shall not be changed by the Board or the Superintendent except as provided by law, Board policy, or administrative regulation. (Education Code 49066)

For grades TK-5, students' level of progress shall be reported as follows:

- 4 Exceeding Grade-Level Standard
- 3 Meeting Grade-level Standard
- 2 Approaching Grade-Level Standard

1 Not Meeting Grade-Level Standard

For grades 6-12, grades for achievement shall be reported for each grading period as follows:

A	(90-100%)	Outstanding Achievement 4.0 grade points
B C	(80-89%) (70-79%)	Above Average Achievement 3.0 grade points Average Achievement 2.0 grade points
D	(60-69%)	Below Average Achievement 1.0 grade points
F	(0-59%)	Little or No Achievement 0 grade points
I	Incomplete	0 grade points

When reporting student performance to parents/guardians, teachers may add narrative descriptions, observational notes, and/or samples of classroom work in order to better describe student progress in specific skills and subcategories of achievement.

A report card for a student with a disability may contain information about his/her disability, including whether that student received special education or related services, provided that the report card informs parents/guardians about their child's progress or level of achievement in specific classes, course content, or curriculum. However, transcripts that may be used to inform postsecondary institutions or prospective employers of the student's academic achievements shall not contain information disclosing the student's disability.

Effect of Absences on Grades

If a student misses class without an excuse and does not subsequently turn in homework, take a test, or fulfill another class requirement which he/she missed, the teacher may lower the student's grade for nonperformance.

Grade Point Average

The Superintendent or designee shall determine the methodology to be used in calculating students' grade point averages (GPA), including the courses to be included within the GPA and whether extra grade weighting shall be applied to Advanced Placement, honors, and/or concurrent postsecondary courses.

AR 5121 Students

The Superintendent or designee shall inform teachers of the district's policy regarding grading, including expectations that grades shall be based on factors that directly measure students' knowledge and skills in the content area and shall not include nonacademic factors.

Report cards displaying students' grades in each subject or course shall be distributed to parents/guardians at the end of each grading period. Parents/guardians shall be offered an opportunity to meet with their child's teacher(s) to discuss the grades and strategies to improve their child's performance.

(cf. 6020 - Parent Involvement)

Whenever it becomes evident to a teacher that a student is in danger of failing a course, the teacher shall arrange a conference with the student's parent/guardian or send the parent/guardian a written report. (Education Code 49067)

(cf. 5123 - Promotion/Acceleration/Retention)

For each student in grades 9-12, the Superintendent or designee shall maintain a transcript recording the courses taken, the term that each course was taken, credits earned, final grades, and date of graduation.

Grades for Achievement

For grades TK-5, students' level of progress shall be reported as follows:

- 4 Exceeding Grade-Level Standard
- 3 Meeting Grade-level Standard
- 2 Approaching Grade-Level Standard
- 1 Not Meeting Grade-Level Standard

For grades 6-12, grades for achievement shall be reported for each grading period as follows:

A	(90-100%)	Outstanding Achievement 4.0 grade points
В	(80-89%)	Above Average Achievement 3.0 grade points
С	(70-79%)	Average Achievement 2.0 grade points
D F	(60-69%) (0-59%)	Below Average Achievement 1.0 grade points Little or No Achievement 0 grade points
I	Incomplete	0 grade points

An Incomplete shall be given only when a student's work is not finished by the end of the grading period because of illness or other excused absence. If not made up within six weeks, the Incomplete shall become an F.

Because of the more rigorous nature of Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, honors, and concurrent postsecondary courses, students receiving a grade of A, B, or C in those courses shall receive extra grade weighting as follows:

A	(90-100%)	Outstanding Achievement 5.0 grade points

Grades for Physical Education

No grade of a student participating in a physical education class may be adversely affected due to the fact that the student, because of circumstances beyond his/her control, does not wear standardized physical education apparel. (Education Code 49066)

Student performance in high school physical education courses shall be based upon evaluation of the student's individual progress, attainment of goals in each instructional area, tests designed to determine skill and knowledge, and physical performance tests. (5 CCR 10060)

High school students using interscholastic athletic participation to fulfill physical education requirements, as authorized by Education Code 51242, may be graded on this participation provided a teacher credentialed to teach physical education supervises this participation and

assigns the grade.

Grades for College Courses

When the district has approved a student to receive district credit for coursework completed at a community college or four-year college, he/she shall receive the same letter grade as is granted by the college.

Grades for Citizenship and Work Habits

Any grades assigned for citizenship or work habits, such as effort or study skills, shall be reported as follows:

- O Outstanding
- S Satisfactory
- N Needs Improvement

Pass/Fail Grading

The Superintendent or designee may identify courses or programs for which students may, with parent/guardian permission, elect to earn a Pass or Fail grade instead of a letter grade.

Students who receive a Pass grade shall acquire the appropriate semester units of credit for the course. The grade shall not be counted in determining class rank, honors list, or membership in the California Scholarship Federation. Students who receive a Fail grade shall not receive credit for taking the course.

Peer Grading

At their discretion, teachers may use peer grading of student tests, papers, and assignments as appropriate to reinforce lessons.

Repeating Classes

With the approval of the principal or designee, a student may repeat a course in order to raise his/her grade. Both grades received shall be entered on the student's transcript, but the student shall receive credit only once for taking the course. The highest grade received shall be used in determining the student's overall grade point average (GPA).

Withdrawal from Classes

A student who drops a course during the first six weeks of the grading period may do so without

any entry on his/her permanent record card. A student who drops a course after the first six weeks of the grading period shall receive an F grade on his/her permanent record, unless otherwise decided by the principal or designee because of extenuating circumstances.

Effect of Absences on Grades

Teachers who choose to withhold class credit because of excessive unexcused absences shall so inform students and parents/guardians of such a possibility at the beginning of the school year or semester. When a student reaches the number of unexcused absences defined as excessive in Board policy, the student and parent/guardian shall again be notified of the district's policy regarding excessive unexcused absences.

The student and parent/guardian shall have a reasonable opportunity to explain the absences. (Education Code 49067)

If a student receives a failing grade because of excessive unexcused absences, the student's record shall specify that the grade was assigned because of excessive unexcused absences. (Education Code 49067)

Grades for a student in foster care shall not be lowered if the student is absent for any reason specified in Education Code 49069.5.

Grade Point Average

The Superintendent or designee shall calculate each student's GPA using the grade point assigned to each letter grade in accordance with the scale described in the section "Grades for Academic Performance" above. The grade points for all applicable coursework shall be totaled and divided by the number of courses completed. Pass/Fail grades shall not be included in the determination of a student's GPA.

(cf. 5126 - Awards for Achievement) (cf. 6145 - Extracurricular and Cocurricular Activities)

When plus and minus designations are added to letter grades, they shall not be considered in determining GPA.

Each academic year, the Superintendent or designee shall provide to the Student Aid Commission the GPA of all district students in grade 12, except for students who have opted out or are permitted by the rules of the Student Aid Commission to provide test scores in lieu of the GPA. (Education Code 69432.9)
