

Many questions have been surfacing and we hope this helps to answer all of them:

“PARENT HOMESCHOOL” INFORMATION

Parents create or purchase curriculum and it is recommended that you register with the Regional Office of Education 20. For parents choosing to use homeschool programs/curriculums this 20-21 school year: All credits and/or grades transferred into Gallatin County Schools to your child’s student records and transcripts must be from an accredited school recognized by Illinois State Board of Education. Please look on the Illinois State Board website for a current list of ISBE approved programs located here <https://www.isbe.net/Pages/Homeschool.aspx> Gallatin County CUSD 7 cannot accept grades from on-line schools that do not hold Illinois State Board accreditation. For promotion and transcript purposes please choose carefully if you plan to homeschool and later return your student to the district. **The only exception to the ISBE policy would be an executive order filed by the Governor to change the process; at this time we do not anticipate this action.

GALLATIN SCHOOL “IN-PERSON LEARNING”

Students are taught in the classroom by their teacher at Gallatin County CUSD 7 Schools. Every student grades 1-12 who register as an in-person learner will be given a chromebook to be taken back and forth from home to school each day. Internet services will be provided in the classroom during the day and in every town via school bus hotspots.

GALLATIN SCHOOLS “VIRTUAL LEARNING”

Teachers create and provide curriculum to all Gallatin County Virtual Learners. Our school district is offering every child registered in the school district grades 1-12 a chromebook to be used at home for virtual lessons each day. Internet services will be provided via school bus hotspots in every town.
