Job Goal: To provide safe and efficient transportation to all learners and to represent RSU No. 67 in a professional manner during daily transportation activities.

Responsibilities:

- Operate vehicles according to all laws and regulations;
- Maintain discipline of learners in a positive manner;
- Complete required records and reports;
- Implement any new regulations or directives that are given;
- Stop at designated bus stops;
- Drive safely and courteously;
- Treat learners respectfully;
- Report any and all mechanical failures to the bus garage mechanic;
- Communicate and interact professionally with co-workers, learners, parents, coaches, teachers, and community;
- Accept accountability for decisions, actions, and statements;
- Keep bus clean inside and outside;
- Sweep bus after each morning run, and after each trip;
- Perform job requirements with minimum amount of supervision and make sound decisions in adverse situations:
- Educate learners on bus safety on a continual basis;
- Arrive on time for all bus trips;
- Complete all required paperwork in a timely manner, (time cards, trip sheets etc.);
