New Calendar

- School will resume on Wednesday, September 2nd.
- Virtual / Phone Conferences on 10/1/2020, and 10/08/2020

- Virtual / Phone Conferences 2/18/2021, and 2/25/2021
- Spring Break 3/29/2021-4/2/2021
- School day will run from 8:30am-3:00pm
 - Cafeteria will be open for before school child care for students in K-6
- Snow days will now be remote learning days
 - Teachers will teach lessons from home, students will need to show completion of work.
- Last day of School 5/27/2021

Option 1 - Remote Learning From Home

- This option represents a LOW health risk as it relates to COVID-19 but a relatively MODERATE educational risk as a result of not being on campus with teachers each day.
- Students will be issued a district owned laptop to access Google Classrooms.
- Attendance will be taken each day and students must log in daily.
 - Students will be required to turn in an assignment daily.
- Grades issued will be A-F and the work/learning will be the same as it will be for students on site.

Option 1 - Cont.

- Communication will be done mostly through email
 - Please be patient with our teachers as they are teaching in classrooms from 8:30-3:00
 - Email addresses have been set up to help assist students during those hours
 - Grades 4-8 please email: 4-8remotelearning@locklandschools.org
 - Grades 9-12 please email: 9-12remotelearning@locklandschools.org
- Students will be provided breakfast and lunch each week
- Students will be able to participate in extracurricular activities as long as they maintain eligibility and attendance requirements.
- Remote Learning commitments will be for a minimum of one semester.
- **Please note this option will NOT look the same as it did from March through May 2020**

Option 2 - On-Site Learning in Classroom

- This options represents a MODERATE health risk as it relates to COVID-19 exposure and a LOW educational impact risk as a result of being on campus with teachers each day.
- Students will attend class 5 days a week from 8:30AM-3:00 PM
- Per the Health and Safety Guidelines issued by Governor DeWine and in collaboration with the Ohio Department of Health and the Ohio Department of Education, the following expectations are included with our on-site learning plan:
 - Assess for Symptoms
 - Wash and sanitize hands
 - Clean and sanitize the school environment
 - Practice social distancing
 - Implementation of a face covering policy

COVID-19 Precautions

- Students and staff will be asked to check temperatures before coming to school.
 - If temperature is higher than 100 degrees or symptoms of COVID-19 are present, STAY HOME!
 - If a student or staff member begins to show symptoms or has a temperature exceeding 100 degrees during the school day, they will be separated from others, given a face covering and monitored by a staff member in an area separate from the health aid station.
- Hand sanitizer stations will be present at each entry to the building and within all rooms of the building
- Classrooms, common areas and high frequency touch areas will be sanitized at least once per day. Doors will remain open as permitted by fire code to avoid touching handles and bathrooms will be cleaned throughout the day.

Option 2 - Cont.

- Students will be placed into a cohort and will remain in the cohort for the entire day.
 - This will cut down on transitions through the hallway
 - Teachers will switch from room to room
- Students will receive instruction via Google Chromebooks.
 - Students will be able to take these Chromebooks home
 - Students will not share Chromebook devices
 - When students are ill they can continue learning from home with their Chromebook.
 - This will help remote learners and classroom learners receive the same experience

Option 2 - Cont.

- Social distancing requirements will be in place throughout the school.
 - Desks will be placed apart from one another.
 - Students will not work in physical groups, but rather through collaboration on Google.
 - There will be no shared items (crayons, markers, highlighters, etc.)
 - Face coverings will be required when social distancing cannot be achieved
 - 9th/10th graders will be on the 2nd floor only, 11th/12th graders will be on the 1st floor only.
 - No lockers
 - Water fountains will be turned off; students must bring water bottles to school.
- Elective courses will be impacted and schedules will be changing.
 - Student cohorts will follow the same schedule
 - 3 cohorts per grade level

How can you help?

- Take your students temperature in the morning/monitor for symptoms
 - If student has a temperature keep them home!
 - If symptoms are present, keep student at home for online learning
- Send student to school with a filled water bottle
- Bring hand sanitizer/wash hands
 - We will have hand sanitizer at all entrances of the school and in classrooms but never hurts to have a personal bottle.
- Explain the seriousness of adhering to expectations to your child
 - If students choose not to follow on-site regulations they will be placed in Remote Learning
