

Rules and Procedures
Mrs. Steider's ELA and Social Studies Classroom

Classroom Description:

ELA: This class will focus on reading, writing, grammar, listening, and speaking through a variety of different methods.

SS: This class will focus on the United States regions and states, colonization, exploration, the Revolutionary War, Western Expansion, the Industrial Revolution, the Constitution, the election process, and the Civil War.

Classroom Rules: *Respect yourself, others, and property*

1. Bring all required materials (notebook, folder, agenda, pencil bag with all supplies in it, ipad, AR book, and completed homework) with you to class on time. You will be last in the lunch line if you must return to your locker to obtain these items or if you are late to class.
2. Wait outside the classroom to be invited in at which point you should enter the classroom quietly and follow the directions given on the board to begin the class.
3. If the teacher is talking, their voice should be the only one heard. When a student is sharing, theirs is the only voice that should be heard.
4. Follow all directions quickly.
5. Stay seated and working until you are told to begin cleaning up and to be dismissed by the teacher.
6. Use the restroom and get a drink between classes (water bottles are allowed). You may only go to the restroom during independent work time. No other food or drinks will be allowed. Gum and mints are okay as long as no issues arise.
7. Flexible seating can be used by students who can focus on their work without goofing around, move themselves to a new spot that helps them do their best if they need, do not distract others, clean up after themselves, walk to spots at their designated time, and use seating appropriately per standards set by Mrs. Steider. A teacher reserves the right to move any student at any time.
8. Bring a positive and kind attitude as well as a strong work ethic with you to class each day.

All rules from the student handbook will be enforced.

***Students who are not following expectations will attend retraining sessions at a time determined by the teacher.**

Grading: (per the district's Grading for Learning policy)

-80% of your grade will be composed of summative assessments. This includes tests, quizzes, projects, presentations, and final drafts.

-20% of your grade will be composed of formative assessments. This includes daily work, rough drafts, and study guides.

- All work is due on the assigned due date. If your work is not completed at that time, you will spend your study hall time working on it until it is complete. You may also need to attend ESR II or miss out on Game of the Week to complete assignments.

-If work is not completed by the assigned due date, a student's name will be placed on the ICU list until that assignment is completed.

-If you do poorly on a summative task you have **one** retake opportunity after remediation with me has occurred. The score you receive on the retake is the score that will be recorded.

-There is no extra credit.

Absences:

-You will have **three** days to complete any work missed during your absence. If it is not completed within this time frame, it will be recorded as missing in PowerSchool.

-When you know in advance that you are going to be gone, you are expected to notify me prior to your absence in order to get the day's work and have it done before leaving. BE RESPONSIBLE!!

Classroom Procedures:

1. Enter the room calmly and sit down at your assigned seat to begin working on the bell ringer right away.
2. When in the classroom you need to be seated quietly in your assigned spot.
3. Use class time productively to limit the homework that you have.
4. Share your ideas and listen to those of others in a respectful way.
5. Stay positive, enthusiastic, and determined!!!
