## SCENARIO \# I: HYBRID INSTRUCTION

STUDENTS ATTEND THEIR COHORT
$(1,2,3)$ AND PARTICIPATE IN REMOTE DAYS

## ALL SELF-CONTAINED PROGRAMS PRESCHOOL, ELEMENTARY, MIDDLE, EMGNC/OBHS

I. All Self-Contained programs will be offered to attend Monday, Wednesday, and Friday,
2. Transportation will be provided for all three days.
3. Includes the following programs:
I. Multiply Disabled (MD) Program- Shepard, Sandburg, OBHS
2. Learning and Language Disabled (LLD) Program- All elementary programs, Sandburg, EMGNC, OBHS
3. Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) Program- Schirra, Sandburg, EMGNC
4. Behavior Improvement Program (BIP)- Madison Park, Sandburg
5. Preschool (PSD) Full Program (only)- Southwood and Glenn

## RESOURCE PROGRAM

- Per NJAC 6A-I4, resource class numbers on any given Cohort Day, cannot exceed nine (9) students on the elementary level (must include a paraprofessional). Resource classes can not exceed twelve (I2) students on Secondary Level (must include a paraprofessional).
- Resource students will attend with their Cohort on their assigned day.
- Resource students will be instructed in the Pull-out model.
- Resource students will be required to wear masks and maintain social distancing when moving through the hallways.
- All Resource students will receive remote instruction on the Tuesdays and Thursdays
- Resource rooms will be moved to larger class settings across the district wherever possible
- Students with a multi-program schedule (i.e. Resource pull out and general education, LLD and resource setting, etc) will attend their scheduled Cohort day and their schedule will be finalized based on building use and student attendance
- Student programs will be reviewed periodically to determine viability of additional in-person days for students based on IEP goals and social distancing protocols within the physical classroom space
- In-class resource students will follow their Cohort each week.
- Procedures will include the following:
- Resource teachers will call down to classrooms prior to the student transitioning to Resource Program.


## PRESCHOOL

- PSD Full will be attending Monday, Wednesday, and Friday
- PSD Half, Integrated, and Tuition students will attend two (2) days per week based on the Cohort Model*
- PSD Half, Integrated, Tuition students will attend during their assigned Cohort and one additional day

## PRESCHOOL (CONTINUES)

- Preschool will continue to run on AM and PM Sessions with adjusted hours in alignment with elementary school times
- Classrooms will be disinfected between sessions
- Parent Presentation on Preschool Procedures will be released August IOth
- Tuition adjustment during Hybrid Model will be:
- Half-day tuition- \$200.00*
- Full-day tuition- $\$ 450.00^{*}$
*Subject to change based on if the district returns to full-day, inperson instruction at any time during the 2020-202I school year.
All tuition preschool programs will require payment each month.

## WHY CHOOSE OPTION 1:

- Students access Special Education Staff with appropriate Certification and Expertise on working with students needing special education and related services


## RELATED SERVICES (OT/PT/ST)

- Related Services will be provided on in-person days and on virtual days
- Related Service Providers will provide services during the OBEA contracted hours.
- Related Service Providers will be required to provide two (2) schedules: One for the Hybrid/Remote Learning model and one for ALL Remote Model (if schools are ordered closed by the Governor)
- The provision of Related Services will be based the 3:I Related Service Model. Related Service Providers will utilize Related Service weeks for evaluation
- Related services will be potentially provided in both a push-in and pull-out model depending on student needs and physical constraints of the buildings
- Sample procedures:
- Teachers will send students out into the hall to walk, socially distanced, from the speech therapist. Once in the office, teachers and students will sit socially distanced with at least six feet between them. Masks will be worn throughout sessions; however, a plastic barrier will be placed between students and teachers in the event that a mask needs to be removed briefly to deliver appropriate therapy. Students provided with remote services will be given the materials they need to keep at home
