



School begins for Students on Monday, August 17

Fillmore Central Schools will begin the 2020-2021 school year for students on Monday, August 17th. All essential school supplies for students are provided at each building. Students may want to have a backpack to help with transporting books and supplies to and from the classroom and home.

Breakfast/Lunch Program

Breakfast price for this school year is \$1.70 for students in grades K-12. Lunch Prices for this year are \$2.70 for grades K-4, \$3.05 for grades 5-12, and Adult prices are \$3.55. Milk or water is provided; an extra milk costs 50 cents.

Busing/Transportation

Bob Taylor is the bus coordinator for Fillmore Central. Mr. Taylor’s cell phone number is 402-759-1034.

If you are a returning student and plan on riding the bus to school again this year, your bus driver will be contacting you with an approximate pick-up and take-home time. If you are a new student that will be riding for the first time, please call Mr. Taylor so that he can place you on the route list.

We will shuttle students in grades 5 through 8 from the High School to the Middle School each morning. The shuttle buses are scheduled to arrive at the High School at 7:50 a.m. There is one bus for each grade. Students that arrive prior to 7:50 are to report to the High School cafeteria where they are under supervision until the buses arrive. The buses will arrive at the Middle School at approximately 8:05.

When the Middle School is dismissed at 3:20, the shuttle buses will deliver students back to the Elementary and the High Schools. If you have any questions concerning the shuttle buses, please call Bob Taylor at 402-759-1034 or the District Office at 402-759-4955.

COVID Related Items

Water Bottles

Families are asked to provide a water bottle for their student(s). The school will provide a water bottle if a student arrives at school without one. Students will be allowed to fill water bottles at the hands free bottle filling stations, but water fountains will not be available for use.

Masks/Face Covering

Students are required to wear masks/face coverings at school unless they have previously been signed out by a parent or guardian. Students will be given several opportunities throughout the school day to have mask breaks. Shields are not the same as masks or other face covers, so they will not be permitted as a replacement for a mask/face covering.

Volunteers/Visitors

Due to COVID we are going to begin the year without classroom volunteers or visitors to school for lunch, etc.

New Staff Members

Liz Zoucha will be joining the Fillmore Central Elementary teaching staff as the Title I teacher. Ms. Zoucha graduated from the University of Nebraska Kearney and will be starting her 4th year of teaching at the elementary level. Student Materials

For the 2020-2021 school year Fillmore Central Elementary is providing all required supplies needed in the classroom for all students. A book bag is the only item that families will need to provide for students. This commitment ensures every student is equally equipped to be successful at FCES.

Fillmore Central continues to abide by the school district wellness policy that affects all snacks and treats consumed at school. All food items that are brought into the school must follow the smart snacks standards. Additional information will be sent home with students, and will also be found on the school website.

Handbooks and Student Registration Forms

Parent/Student handbooks will be sent home with each student on the first day of school. **Included in the handbook are forms that need to be completed and returned to your child's teacher by Monday, August 24th.** These forms will contain important information specific to your child. Thank you in advance for promptly returning the forms.

Kindergarten/New Student Open House

Students that are transitioning into kindergarten, or are new to Fillmore Central, are invited to attend an open house at Fillmore Central Elementary. To minimize crowds, we are asking families to attend based on the following scheduled times. Last names starting with A-L Thursday, August 13th, from 2:30 – 4:00 p.m. Last names starting with M-Z Friday, August 14th, from 2:30 – 4:00 p.m. PLEASE PLAN ON ATTENDING WITH YOUR CHILD(REN). You should plan on meeting your child's teacher, seeing your child's classroom, and touring the building. Masks/face coverings are required to attend this event. Contact the school if you are unable to attend your scheduled time.

Elementary Parent Advisory Committee (E.P.A.C.)

- When do we meet? The last Monday of August, November and March at 7:00 p.m.
- Meetings last 1 hour or less.
- What is it?

E-PAC is an advisory group of parents / guardians of elementary students who share and discuss information about our school. Any parent / guardian of an elementary age child in grades K – 4 is invited to attend. There is no expense – just the investment of your time.

Arriving at School

The school day begins at 8:05 a.m. The tardy bell rings at 8:10 a.m. Breakfast is served from 7:30-8:00 a.m. **Students should arrive no earlier than 7:30 a.m.** All students are to enter through the front doors and are wearing masks.

1. **Parents/Guardians are asked not to accompany their child to designated waiting areas prior to the beginning of the school day to minimize the amount of visitors to the building.**
2. **Students arriving at school between 7:30 – 7:55 a.m. report to the lunchroom. Please enter through the front doors.**
3. **Students arriving between 7:55 – 8:05 a.m.**

“K”	Report to the music room
1 st grade	Report to the gym
2 nd -4 th Grades	Report to lunchroom
4. **Students are not allowed to wait for the 8:05 a.m. “bell” anywhere outside the building unless they are supervised by their parent / guardian.**

Breakfast

Breakfast is served each school morning starting at 7:30 a.m. Breakfast service stops at 7:55 a.m. to ensure students have time to eat and transition to their classrooms at 8:05 a.m. Cost for breakfast is \$1.70. If your child eats breakfast, the cost will be deducted from your child’s lunch account.

Hot Lunch

Once COVID restrictions allow, Parents/Guardians are welcome to eat with their child. When you plan to eat school lunch with your child please call the school before 9:30 a.m. so a lunch can be prepared for you. Please note, hot lunches for elementary students are prepared at the high school each day, so it is important that we have an accurate count of adults. Thank you for your help in this matter.

Milk Money for “K” and 1st Grade

Students in Kindergarten and 1st grade can purchase milk for their daily A.M. milk breaks for \$22.00 per quarter.

Registration Requirements (Immunizations, birth certificate, etc...)

Please note that Nebraska State Law requires all Kindergartners and all out-of-state transfer students to have:

- 3 doses of DTP with one given on or after the 4th birthday
- 3 doses of polio
- 2 doses of MMR, and
- 3 doses of Hepatitis B
- 2 doses of Chicken pox: Must have the immunization **or** a note stating the date when your child had chicken pox.
- Influenza type b (Hib)
- Invasive pneumococcal disease
- Physical exam
- Vision Exam
- Certified copy of the birth certificate (the copy from the hospital does not meet this requirement).

These required documents must be on file prior to the start of the school year. Please be sure this is taken care of prior to August 17th so your child does not have to miss the first day of school. **Tip:** Do not wait until the last minute to find these items. It takes some time to collect copies from various agencies. Please be diligent about collecting the necessary paperwork, and call if you have questions.

Boxtops for Education

During the 2019-2020 school year Fillmore Central Elementary generated over \$1300 in revenue through Boxtops for Education. Boxtop funds were used to go on fieldtrips, see a movie at the theater and provide food and other treats during the school year. Please continue to scan your receipts with the Boxtops app to help Fillmore Central Elementary.

Middle School News

I am excited for the opportunity to work with all of our students and parents and eager to begin another great year here at Fillmore Central Middle School. Yes, this year will begin differently than any past year with the COVID-19 virus still present. The administration team has been meeting weekly for the past five weeks to put together a plan that puts the safety of our students and staff up front. Please check the school's website – www.fillmorecentral.org - for the most recent information.

5th Grade Student Building Tour

The middle school will be hosting a building tour for incoming 5th grade students on Friday, August 14, between 4:00 PM to 6:00 PM at the middle school in Fairmont. It is requested that only one parent/guardian attend with their student so we can limit the number of people in the building. Both the student and parent are required to wear facemasks or a face covering when they are in the building. Masks will be available if needed. Parents and students will be given a packet that contains the student's schedule (listing their locker number), student/parent handbook that includes signature pages for parents and students to sign and return, Powerschool login codes, and other information for the beginning of the school year. Along with receiving their packets, students and parents will be given a brief tour of the building and will meet some of their teachers. Students will be permitted to put limited items in their locker following the tour. To make the tours more efficient students have been assigned to a time based on alphabetical order of their last name. Please call the middle school office - 402.268.3411 – if your assigned time does not work for you. All efforts will be made to accommodate individual requests, but we ask that you respect the need to limit the size of each tour. Tours will begin at the middle school office. Please enter through the main entrance on the south side of the building. Groups based on the student's last name are as follows:

- A-H – 4:00 p.m. – 4:45 p.m.
- I – O – 4:45 p.m. – 5:30 p.m.
- P – Z - 5:30 p.m. – 6:15 p.m.

Students in Grades 6th – 8th

The middle school building will be open for limited hours beginning Wednesday, August 12 through Friday, August 14 for students entering grades 6th – 8th at the times listed below. We request that only the student and one parent/guardian enter the building using the main entrance on the south side of the building. Both the student and parent are required to wear facemasks or a face covering when they are in the building. Masks will be available if needed. When in the building students will be directed to pick up a packet that contains their class schedule (listing their locker number), student/parent handbook that includes signature pages for parents and students to sign and return either that day or during the first week of school, Powerschool login codes, along with other information for the beginning of the school year. Students will be permitted to put limited items in their locker at this time. There will NOT be an open house for grades 6th-8th on Friday, August 14. We ask that students limit their time in the building to no more than 15 minutes. Please call the middle school office – 402.268.3411 if you have any questions or concerns.

New Students

Registration for new students is now underway. Please call 268-3411 to set up an appointment or stop by the middle school office anytime during the day to register any student entering the 5th, 6th, 7th, or 8th grade. If you wish, a tour of the building can also be provided at your convenience. We recommend that new students register with the school as early as possible so that all paperwork can be completed prior to the start of school. As a part of the registration process, you will need to provide the school with a birth certificate, vaccination records, and contact information from your previous school. Students moving from another state are required to have a physical also (forms can be picked up at the school). All 7th grade students are required to have a physical (even if not moving from another state) and any 7th or 8th grade student who wishes to participate in activities will be required to have the necessary paperwork submitted before they will be allowed to practice.

Classroom Supplies

The district will again be providing the needed student classroom supplies for the upcoming school year. Therefore there will not be individual classroom supply lists sent out. The only thing students will need to provide will be their own backpack. We hope this will assist families in getting ready for a successful school year.

Water Bottles

At this time students will not be allowed to drink directly from the school's water fountains. Rather, students are encouraged to bring a water bottle from home and fill them up at school as needed. The building is in the process of updating our current water fountains into filling stations for water bottles. The school will provide a water bottle for any student that needs one.

School Breakfast

Fillmore Central will continue to serve breakfast at all our sites this year. Those middle school students that will be riding the shuttle bus from Geneva will be able to eat breakfast in the high school cafeteria beginning at 7:30 a.m. The buses will load at approximately 7:50 a.m. for the trip to the middle school. Breakfast will be served in the middle school cafeteria from 7:40 a.m. – 8:00 a.m. for those students not riding the shuttle buses and for those not having the opportunity to eat in Geneva due to their bus route.

Shuttle Bus

Shuttle buses from Geneva to Fairmont will leave the high school each morning at 7:50AM. **All students riding shuttle buses are required to wear a face mask/face covering for the duration of the ride.** There will be four buses so that each grade will have its own bus; drivers and other staff will assist students the first day in boarding the correct bus. Students who ride the shuttle bus to Fairmont will be asked to sit in the high school cafeteria while waiting for the bus each morning. Students should enter the high school through the main doors and proceed directly to the cafeteria. Breakfast will be served beginning at 7:30 a.m. If your student is not eating breakfast we ask that they not arrived before 7:40 a.m. **At the end of the day, the shuttle buses will unload at the high school at approximately 3:35 PM.** We ask that parents not park in the fire lane in front of the high school while picking up or waiting for middle school students.

School Day

The middle school day will begin at **8:05 a.m.** and will **end at 3:20 p.m.** Scheduled early dismissal days will be at **1:20 p.m.** Transportation will continue as in the past.

First Day Of School

The school year for students will begin with a full day of classes on Monday, August 17, at 8:05 AM and will end at 3:20 PM.

Early Dismissals

There will be a 2-hour early dismissal on Wednesday, September 2nd. Additionally, we will have 2-hour early dismissals on the first Wednesday of every month throughout the school year. The early-dismissals are so that our staff can regularly engage in professional development designed to improve student performance and meet our school improvement goals.

For middle school students, the 2-hour early dismissal time is 1:20 PM. On the days that we have scheduled early dismissals, the normal bus and supervision routines will take place at the end of the day except that everything will happen 2-hours earlier than normal.

School Website and Twitter

Fillmore Central will continue to use the school's website as a valuable source of communication. Our goal is to continue to make the website a more complete, current, and interactive communication tool. As in the past, you will be able to access PowerSchool through the school's website. I encourage you to make regular use of the website and I welcome any feedback you feel might help us improve communication. The address to our website is www.fillmorecentral.org. School Messenger Automated Phone Service

The district will continue using an automated calling system to notify students and parents of special events (school closings, etc.). We will be using this service again this year and we will allow each student's parents to be accessed by as many as three phone numbers. Registration sheets will be in student packets and should be returned to the school with the student. Phone numbers are listed per student, not per family, so ***you will be required to complete a sheet for each student in your household***. Please take the time to consider what phone numbers would be most appropriate for you to use in order to be notified of school closings, emergencies, etc.

Online Grade Access

We are committed to having strong communication with students and parents in regards to every aspect of student performance and development. One of the tools that we use to communicate with parents and students regarding academic performance is our online grade access. Our teachers are encouraged to update student grade information weekly so you can check your student's grades through the district's online student management system - Powerschool.

To access the Powerschool website, go to the district website, hover over the middle school tab, and select Powerschool from the drop-down menu. You will now need to enter the username and password that is listed in the letter you received in your student's back-to-school packet. If you have forgotten or misplaced your password and username please contact the office and we can give you that information.

High School News

As we kick-off the 2020-21 school year, I can't wait to get our students and staff back in the building. I don't think anyone could have predicted how last year would have ended, nor can we predict how this year will go, but I am excited that we are ready to have school back open and ready for business on August 17th.

COVID-19

We will have several safety measures in place related to COVID-19. My hope is that we will get back to "normal", sooner than later, but in the meantime, we are going to take several precautions to protect our students and staff. Please keep in mind that additional measures can be put in place should the situation warrant.

- Water fountains will only be accessible via the water bottle filling station. With that in mind, each student is allowed to bring a water bottle to school, and that water bottle should be taken home and washed daily.
- We will have multiple hand-sanitizing stations in place throughout the building.
- Masks will be required (and provided) when social distancing is not possible. Students will have the option of opting out of the mask requirement. Masks will be required on school transportation as we start the year. Students may not opt out of wearing masks on school transportation.

9th Grade/New Student Day

We have traditionally held a 9th grade/new student laptop checkout/orientation day. We are going to continue with this, however, we will have multiple sessions scheduled instead of one large group session. Masks will be required. Students can report to the high school library on Wednesday, August 12th using the schedule listed below:

- Last name, A-He - 12:30 pm to 1:15 pm
- Last name, Hi - Sha - 1:30 pm to 2:15 pm
- Last name, Shi -Z - 2:30 pm to 3:15 pm

Locker Sign Up/Packet Pick Up

Students may stop at school anytime between 8:00 am and 3:30 pm on August 12th, 13th or 14th to sign up for a locker and pick up their packet. Masks will be required. This will be our best opportunity to distribute masks to each student prior to the first day of school.

Friday, July 24th, 2020 the Fillmore Central High School Commencement ceremony took place at 7:00 PM. The ceremony was streamed on Striv and there was a small audience. The Top Ten Percent of Class, Awards, & Scholarships were presented by Denise Betts and Ryun Theobald to the students. Macy Scott gave the Salutatorian Address at the beginning of the ceremony. Halle Theis gave the Valendictorian Address. The closing address was given by Trevor Meyer. Early Development Network Services Coordination

What is Early Development Network Services Coordination?

Services Coordination helps families of children with special needs below age three:

- Find services to meet developmental, educational, financial, health care, child care, respite care and other needs
- Work with multiple providers to make sure services are provided as needed

Why is Service Coordination Needed?

Nebraska families of children with special needs have found it difficult to locate needed services for infants and toddlers with disabilities and then to coordinate the services with the providers.

Who is Eligible for Services Coordination?

Eligible families are those with an infant or toddler below age 3 who has a disability or developmental delay and qualifies for special education through the public schools.

Year round services coordination is provided.

There is no cost to families.

How Can Families Apply?

To request Early Development services for your child or to refer a child, call the local number below. With prior parental permission, referrals may be made by anyone who suspects a developmental delay in an infant or toddler.
