



7th Grade Outdoor Education Experience

The annual 7th grade outdoor education experience is scheduled April 12th-14th. We leave approximately at 8:30 Wednesday morning after the kids get off the bus and return to school on Friday at 2:30, in order for students to get picked up or ride the bus home. The students will all participate and ride school buses down to the Mackenzie Environmental Center and stay for a trip to be remembered!

Purpose:

The 7th grade outdoor education experience involves three days and two nights of many group activities integrating all content areas within the focus of science and the environment. This experience includes sleeping in cabins, eating around a campfire, archery, building outdoor shelter shelters and survival tactics, digital photography and many more **outdoor** activities. Students are supervised by four teachers, DNR and MacKenzie Center volunteers and staff, and as many parent chaperones whom would like to attend.

Homesickness:

Occasionally, a student will experience homesickness during this experience. Please talk to your child about this prior to the trip. Usually is it becomes more intense if your child contacts home, therefore, students will not be able to call home. We do not let students have their cell phones either. Please remind your student they are safe with their teachers that they see daily and their wonderful classmates.

General Rules and Expectation:

Behave **respectfully** and appropriately at all times. School rules apply. Do not leave lodge area without adult supervision. Stay **productive** and give 100% positive effort with the group during structured time. Participate **responsibly** and **safely** in group activities. We reserve the right to call parents or drive a student home if their behavior is inappropriate.

Medical Issues:

All children require a medical form. This is to ensure your child's safety and beware of your child's medical need. Please make sure daily medications are listed, along with food/outdoor allergies.

Cost:

Most costs for our stay, activities, and travel are paid for by the school district. The true costs for this field trip are your child's meals that will be deducted from your child's lunch account.

Please see the table below to see your family's specific cost break down. Please make sure there is money in your account to cover this cost. Please write out checks for the food service to **Bangor School District**. If your child is on a free or reduced

meal plan, the costs for supper, is unfortunately *not provided in this program*. You will need to send a separate check for this, if this applies to your family, and please know funds are available if necessary to cover these supper costs if needed. Please contact Mrs. Harper if needed, or send a note with your child's paperwork.

As we know, Covid is a concern for the health and safety of all student and staff involved in our district. This trip is an outdoor education trip and mostly outdoors, but it does contain eating in the dining hall with all students and sleeping in a dorm setting with 10-15 of their peers, and two staff or chaperones. Please consider your option and read our policy carefully, as we hope to make every family comfortable with their own choice. We understand that this trip may make our family feel uncomfortable and you may opt your child out. Due to staffing and subbing for our other students while away, we will not be able to offer 7th grade classes so your student will be **required to stay home during this trip**. Please note the requirements below.

Our family chose to opt our completely from the Mackenzie trip, with the understanding my child will stay home during the days of April 12- April 14, 2023. No more needed of any pages, please turn in this page with your signature so we have this as your record.

Exclusions from this trip: Confirmed Positive Case of Co-vid 19:

When a person has a confirmed **positive** case of COVID-19, they must isolate at home for at least 5 days from when the first symptoms began, AND be fever-free without the use of fever-reducing medications for 24 hours AND with improvement in symptoms before returning to school. The count of 5 days begins on the onset of symptoms or the positive test, whichever happened first. Positive cases can return on day 6 and are encouraged to wear a mask at all times for the next 5 calendar days when in the presence of others.

- A person is considered a confirmed case if they have received a positive PCR test or positive antigen test and they are experiencing symptoms of Co-vid 19.
- If a person is not experiencing symptoms but has tested positive with an antigen test they are considered positive unless a negative PCR test has occurred within 48 hours of the positive antigen test.
- -If a student or staff member tests positive outside of school, it is the responsibility of that student or staff's family to immediately notify the school.

Symptoms resulting in exclusion from school:

Staying home when one is ill is one of the most vital strategies to preventing the spread of disease. Students and staff must be kept home or removed from school if any of the following symptoms are present. Please do. Not send your child on the trip if symptoms are occurring.

Parents will be contacted if children have these symptoms on the trip. They will be asked to be picked up from the Mackenzie Center if they are having any of the following symptoms.

- -Fever
- -Loss of taste or smell
- -Persistent Cough
- -Shortness of Breath
- -Vomiting or Diarrhea

2 or more of the following symptoms

- -Runny Nose
- -Sore Throat
- -Headache
- -Body Aches

Chaperones are needed to help supervise our students, help with presentations, and play outside with our students for three days of fun. A


