Goal one is the primary focus of our work in Mechanicsburg. This Goal is measured through the state's report card system as well as several internal measures throughout the year. As as a result of the changing assessment system in the state of Ohio, districts have received some report card information that is based on a one year average rather than a 3 year composite as we have seen in the past. This data is also based on a new testing platform than in previous years.

From what we know about student state assessments results, the district scored above state average in 16 of 23 state assessments. Overall, our proficient percentages were lower than they have been in the past as were valued added and performance index.

College and Career Readiness

One benchmark of specific focus includes the ACT scores of our high school students. We are committed to increasing our school average composite score to be at or above the state average. In 2016.17 students are being exposed to Ohio Means Jobs and their free ACT practice tests. Teachers are also using ACT practice questions each week to further prepare students to be successful when they take the ACT. These efforts all stem from data analysis that shows our students need support to be successful in college and careers.

Hope and Engagement are Measures that Matter in determining current success as well as predicting future success for our students. Mechanicsburg students in grades 5-12 anonymously participated in the gallup poll: Engaged Today Ready for Tomorrow. For the second year, results show that overall our kids feel safe, engaged, and involved. All staff are integral in building relationships so that 100% of students have enthusiasm and hope for the future.



The administrative team has been reading Above the Line by Urban Meyer. His book is based on Tim Kight's leadership model that Events + Response = Outcomes. We are working to refine our Above the Line responses to improve outcomes for students.

The middle school produced the strongest report card meeting all state indicators and showing more than a year's worth of growth. Our assessment results were comparable across the county, though we strive to be the best amongst our surrounding districts. This will continue to be our focus for the 2016.17 state assessments.


Percent of ACT-Tested Students Ready for College Increases in the District.

Are Your Students Ready for College?

Through collaborative research with post-secondary institutions nationwide, ACT has established the following as college courses.

A benchmark score is the minimum score needed on an ACT subject-area test to indicate a 50% chance of obtaining a B or higher or about a 75% chance of obtaining a C or higher in the corresponding credit-bearing college courses.

- English Composition: 18 on ACT English Test
- College Algebra: 22 on ACT Mathematics Test
- Social Science: 22 on ACT Reading Test
- Biology: 23 on ACT Science Test


Overall, the district's per pupil expenditures was \$9,333 with \$5,107 coming from local revenue sources. This is lower than the state's average of \$10,912.65. The district will continue to use funds to promote academics, arts, and athletics while preserving our financial stability.

Here is what we currently have in permanent, renewable, and continuing levies.

- \$189,000 Emergency 10 year renewed in November 2014;
- Permanent Improvement Levy Permanent November 2013;
- Capital Maintenance Levy Permanent associated with the building project;
- Income tax .5% continuing
- Income tax 1% 10 year renewed in November 2015

District enrollment continues to be stable, even slightly higher than last year. The district accepts 145 open enrollment students, which is an increase of 30 students from last school year. The district loses 43 students to surrounding districts or on-line programs. Open enrollment helps with the district's financial stability. An in house preschool program also supports increasing enrollment.

141 students earned perfect attendance for the 1st nine weeks of school. This is an increase from the 2015.16 school year!





The district houses a preschool program within the elementary for both typically developing preschoolers and preschoolers with disabilities. This program promotes kindergarten readiness and helps students be comfortable in the school before they officially start their elementary career. The preschool supports 32 students between a morning afternoon and session Monday-Thursday. The preschool program is operated in conjunction with the Madison Champaign Educational Service Center (ESC).

The district also houses a Multiple Handicapped classroom, servicing students from around the county with similar needs. This is a county unit supported by the Madison Champaign Educational Service Center. The classroom enjoys participating in building events and even works in the cafeteria, supporting the food service staff by assembling breakfast bags daily. There is a focus on daily living skills, identifying community signs, and using money for life skills. The district believes that students need exposure to a variety of academic and social experiences. The more involved students are outside of the classroom, the more likely they are to be engaged in the classroom.





The preschool classroom visited building offices to show off their Halloween costumes; the students performed Happy Halloween in sign language. 





The one to one initiative at Mechanicsburg Schools is going strong in it's fourth year. The district now has over 400 Chromebooks that travel to and from school daily as well as over 300 additional Chromebooks and Chrome Bases on carts or in assigned classrooms and offices. Plans to add additional technology for students is already underway for the next school year, which in two years time should double.

To help support the the process of teaching and learning and keeping the district technology in good working order, the McBurg Tech department has partnered with FreshDesk, an on-line help desk that supports live chatting with our teachers and students, as well as the ability to keep out issues organized and streamlined. FreshDesk also support submitting issues through FaceBook Twitter.


