Uses for these activities:


- I. Use with your reading basal/novel with story vocabulary




Choose 4 of your words from your word list to use in the 4 box chart. Make the below chart in your vocabulary journal or paper.

Sketch to Stretch:



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Design your vocabulary words in a Scrabble board/crossword puzzle style. Each word needs to be linked together. Then, chose half of your words to write in a sentence.




Choose 5 of your words and create an acrostic poem for each of them. Think about what the words mean, the connections you make with them, and other synonyms.

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
Vocabulary Task Card # 6



Write riddles for your vocabulary cards. Try to get specific, details, but don't give the answers away!


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Pick a topic that interests you, and begin researching. Use an alphabox template to record new words you learn about your topic. Try to fill up as many of your alphaboxes as you can!



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Vocabulary Task Card #8




Write your vocabulary words in a list. Next to each word, think of a synonym and antonym that would go with each word.

Ex.


Tired = exhausted \neq energized

Create a cross word puzzle with your vocabulary words. Provide definitions for the unknown word, and draw boxes to connect the words with your other words. Graph paper would help a lot!



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
Vocabulary Task Card # 10


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Create a comic strip story that introduces the word and explains its meaning. Have fun making your story interesting and humorous!



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
Vocabulary Task Card # 12

Use as many of your vocabulary words as you can in your commercial.



Divide your words into syllables. Write your words in a list from the smallest amount of syllables to the largest amount.



Vocabulary Tic-Tac-Toe


Connect 3 in a row to get Tic-Tac-Toe with your vocabulary words! Initial the ones you do, and staple your pages behind your Tic-Tac-Toe board.

Write a short story using at least 7 of your vocabulary words. Underline your words in the story.	Sketch to Stretch – do a quick sketch of your word to show what it means. Write the word and its meaning below your picture. Do this for half of your vocabulary words.	Choose 5 vocabulary words. Write an acrostic poem for each word that tells what the word means. Your vocab word is written sideways and the meaning/explanation uses the vocab word letters.
Write your words on a piece of paper. Then, write a synonym and antonym next to each one.	Design your vocabulary words in a Scrabble format / crossword puzzle format. Each word should be connected in at least 1 way.	Choose half of your vocabulary words. Look up the word in a dictionary and write what part of speech it is. Write a sentence using the word correctly (must be your own sentence, not the one in the dictionary!).
Write a sentence for each of your vocabulary words. Your sentences must show that you know what the word means.	Choose half of your words and write a riddle for each of them.	Create a cartoon strip where the characters correctly use half of your words in a conversation between them.

Randomly write 9 of your vocabulary words in a tic-tac-toe board. Partner with a classmate to play Tic-Tac-Toe. Roll a dice to determine what to do with the vocabulary words for the round.


