Hand sanitizer must be supplied on the bus. ✓ The bus driver, staff, and all students in grades preK-12, if medically feasible, must wear facial coverings while on the bus. Note: there may be situations where it is not safe for the bus driver to wear a facial covering. Decisions about these situations should be made on a case-by-case basis with local public health officials. ✓ Clean and disinfect transportation vehicles before and after every transit route.
