Dear Parents and Community Members,

Imbler School District continues to be an institution of excellence. beating the state average in proficiency rates at nearly all grade levels in every subject. With that said, when looking at individual student achievement, the district has identified opportunities for improvement. To assist in this endeavor, the district will be implementing the Northwest Evaluation Association's (NWEA) Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) to help identify student strengths and areas of concern to better guide instruction. Teachers will continue to learn how best to serve students using the information obtained from MAP data.

The district continues to be committed to the implementation of technology in the classroom by continuing to replace aging equipment. Along with addition of the Chromebooks, aging desktops were replaced in the agriculture business department. The district will begin replacing projects with SmartTVs which will add to the versatility of technology in the classroom.

The elementary school saw great growth in spelling with the return to the Sitton Spelling curriculum where students were taught word patterns rather than being asked to memorize the correct spelling of words. We look forward to the transfer of spelling skills to student writing in all subject areas.
