Requires parental support & guidance, especially with younger students



Teacher(s) available for support
Same teacher to student ratio



Same grading calendars



Everyone learns remotely & will receive a Chromebook



Have access to school clubs & activities

DIFFERENCES

Assigned 1 teacher regardless of grade or content

Required to make weekly contact with teacher either by Zoom, phone, or email

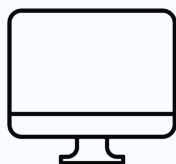
Flexible schedule outside traditional school hours

Assigned their content specific teacher(s)

- Elementary: 1 teacher
- Middle: 6 teachers
- High: 5-6 teachers

Can expect multiple Zooms/Google Meets per week with their teacher(s)

Maintain traditional school hours



Curriculum & materials are designed specifically for online learning

All 6-12 grade materials are online

Only 1 login/password portal

- Edgenuity: K-5
- Odysseyware: 6-12

6-12 grading: A, B, C, D, or F

Online materials either created by the teacher or could be the same as KVA

Teacher may provide books and/or materials

Online presence managed through Google Classroom (K-12)

6-12 grading: A, B, C, or Incomplete



Always available option, enrollment by semester (MS) or trimester (HS, Elementary)

HS students can accelerate course completion, potentially graduate early

Continued enrollment status is contingent on academic progress

Meant to be temporary until we can safely return to the classroom in-person

HS students are held to schedule of completing 5 classes per trimester

All students have continued access

Middle and High School Students Can Take a Blended Schedule of KVA and 2.0 Classes
