


Apache Elementary Guide to Pathblazer/Edgenuity

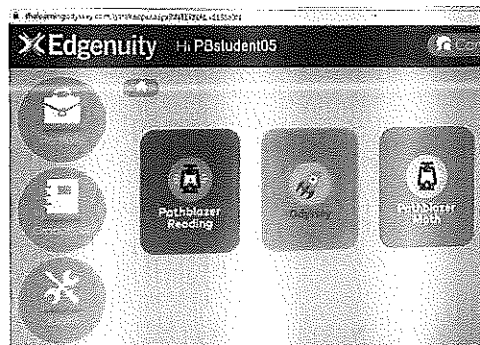
In your address bar, type in this link:

Type in username, password, and Apache in appropriate boxes.

You should now see a screen like this:



The first thing students will need to work on is a reading and math beginning of the year assessment to determine the correct grade and skill level of each student so we can customize their learning.

These two assessments can be paused and returned to. They do not have to complete in one setting.

Let's get started!

First, student will click on Pathblazer Reading. You should see a screen similar to this:

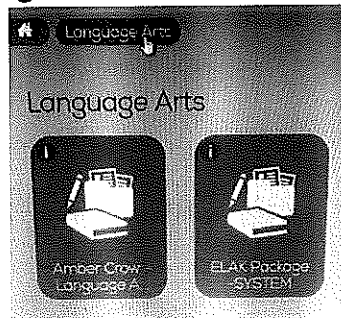


Once students have turned their speakers on, they may click start. Students will need to click submit after each set of questions they finish so their work can be scored.

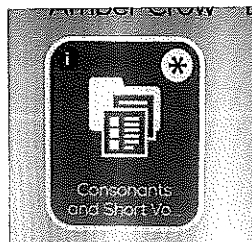
After they finish the reading assessment, they will then complete the Pathblazer Math portion following the same steps.

After students complete both assessments, they will be assigned individualized lessons.

Starting from the home screen (click on house icon at top left corner), Click on Pathblazer Reading the icon will change to a Language Arts icon

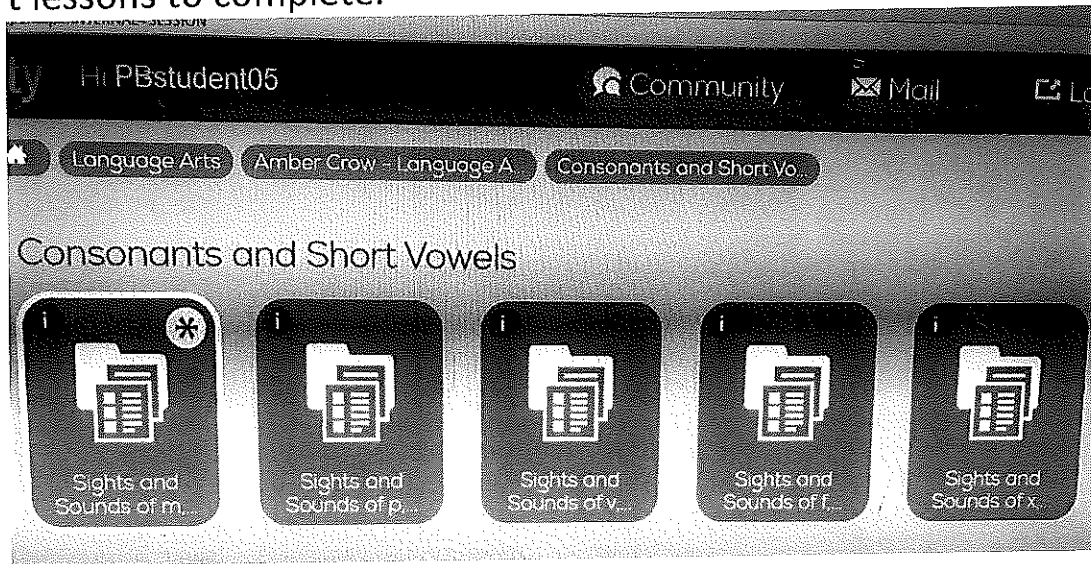


If more than one icon shows up, click on the ELAK Package system. Once you have clicked on the ELAK icon, you will now see a skill icon. Click on it.



There is an asterisk symbol in the top right corner. Any time you see this, it means that this needs to be completed next. That is the first thing you should do.

Click on the single lesson icon and you will see a screen with several short lessons to complete.

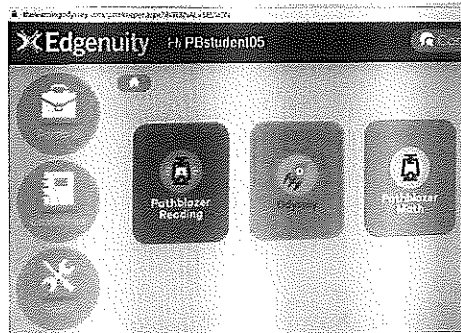


Always go in order starting with the * lessons. Each lesson introduces a concept, has guided practice, independent practice, and assessments.

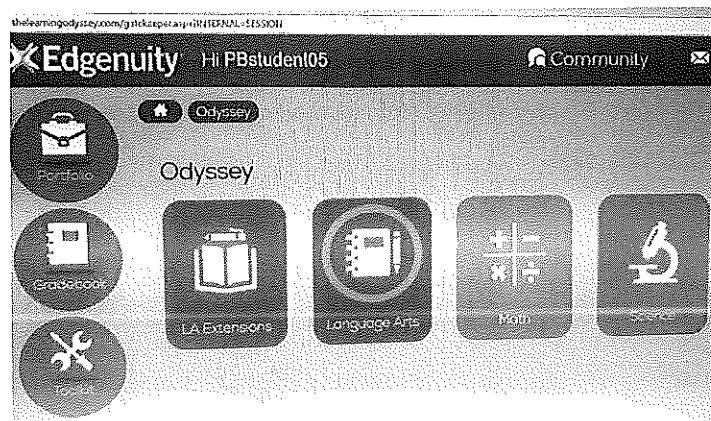
Once you have clicked a box with an asterisk on it, and a new box appears with another asterisk, just keep clicking until you see the word go.

After submitting their work, students can click the home screen icon (house) and complete their math assignment in the same way.

Once math is completed, students should return the home screen (house icon), and they will see three icons.



They should now click on the Odyssey icon, and they will see this screen.



Students will need to click on each subject icon to see if a teacher has added an assignment here. They will go through the same process as before, click on any lesson with an asterisk and work from there.

Things to remember:

1. Log in daily and complete assigned lessons in each subject for days we are in school.
2. Students should be working on an average 30 minutes per subject daily.
3. Report cards will be based on their scores and percentage of completed work. If a student only completes 10 assignments the whole first semester and makes a 100 on all ten, they can still fail because they have not completed the required percentage of work.
4. Do not have students click the X to close out of the program or work will be lost.
5. They need to log out or click the exit button that is usually at bottom left of the screen.
6. The only lesson that can be started, stopped, and returned to is the very beginning assessments in math and reading. All other lessons must be completed in its entirety or data will be lost and they will start over.
7. On the home screen, you will see a portfolio tab on the left side. As students complete their assignments in Pathblazer, they can view real-time data on completed scored activities to quickly and easily track their progress. Many quiz scores are hyperlinked revealing further details on student performance and providing a valuable tool for discussion and intervention.

The reports tab provides students/parents full access to student progress information including activity scores, quiz scores, and time on task.
