From the whiteboard of Superintendent Starr... March 2023

Until my stepdad began facing the pronounced difficulties of dementia, he and my mom had this beautiful rustic cabin in the Upper Peninsula. When my children were smaller (see photo), on one of our visits I took the two oldest (Molly and Jesse) out on the lake to fish. Jesse being the youngest was fine until we started to get a distance from the dock; and then he became frightened and cried. In fact, he cried and cried and cried... My daughter Molly, on the other hand, was ready for the fishing excursion and was at times frustrated by the distraction of her brother's misery. Her perspective was very different from her brother's.

At the time, being a younger parent from a "Toughen up!" upbringing myself, I just kept telling him he'd be fine and, "You need to get over it." The experience was very difficult for him. He wasn't ready for the newness of the event and in retrospect I was not as sensitive to his needs and emotions as I should have been. It's one of those times as a parent I look back on now and wish I'd done differently.

Later in life we had the chance to relive the experience (see photo #2). And, as you can see from the more recent photo, they were both grown up. This reboot experience gave me the chance to tell

my son I was sorry for how I'd been insensitive to him the first time. As I recall, he had very little recollection which helps me see that the incident didn't leave any scars.


We as Shepherd Public Schools face a situation that for some could be like Jesse's experience in that row boat; upsetting, new and feels like it could be devastating; relocating students from elementary schools to the Morey Educational Center. While some folks feel like Jesse and are very uneasy about this new element for our school district, others are like Molly (and how her dad was) and may want to say to others, "You need to get over it." My hope is in all this

we as a district and me as the district's leader do our best to understand, listen and empathize with everyone no matter how you are viewing this relocation initiative at the moment.

We will succeed if we stay together on this.



She wanted to share her tradition with all of our Winn students.





The Bulgarian tradition of Baba Marta

On the 1st week of March Bulgarian friends and family tie a red and white twined thread bracelet on each other's wrists called martenitsa. The symbolism of the colors are: red - is for the red and rosy cheeks which symbolize health; and white - is for the wish of having peace of mind and heart. It's meant to bring good luck throughout the new year! According to tradition, on the 1st of March we welcome Grandmother March, who is a grumpy old lady and wants winter to be over with. She has arrived to remind

us that Spring is just around the corner! It's ok to shed our grumpy shell and bring on the positivity, new beginnings and new life Spring brings with it! We wear the martenitsa until we see the first signs of Spring (red robin, red winged black bird, or any

spring flower such as a crocus or snowdrop). After we see that first sign of Spring, we would tie our bracelets on a fruit bearing tree. While we tie it, we make a wish. In the Spring you'd want to go back to that tree, and if the tree bears lots of fruit that year, your wish will be fruitful as well. However, if it doesn't, there is always next year:)

NEW ELEMENTARY UPDATE



We are so excited to share information with you about our new elementary school building. Each Friday, all of our Elementary students receive an update about the progress of the Morey building. Here is the latest update:

BlueJay Families and Community,

In a continuing effort to provide information about the "new" Winn Elementary located at the Morey Education Center, here is your Friday update. Each week we will be answering questions that are coming from our families.

Who will be the staff in the building?

The teachers at the new building will be; current Winn teachers, Shepherd Elementary teachers, and new teachers to the district. We will have 2 sections of Kindergarten through 5th grade.

What special services are going to be offered at the new building?

We will have the same services offered at both of our current buildings. We will have a full time special education teacher. In addition we will offer speech, social work, occupational therapy, and physical therapy to students that qualify for those services through their I.E.P.

My student receives extra help in reading and math. Will my student get help? Our vision at Winn Elementary is "Everything a Kid Needs." That long standing tradition will continue at the new building. We will provide services to students that need extra help.

Will students stay with current Winn or Shepherd Elementary cohorts K-5? Our goal at the new building is to balance classes. We intend to create classrooms that are balanced between Winn and SE students.


