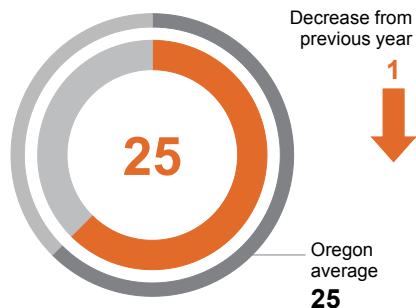

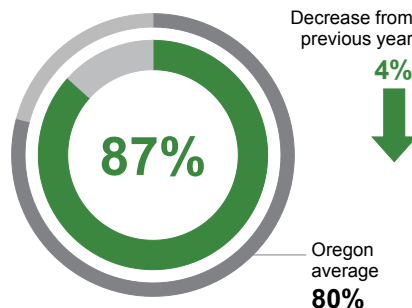

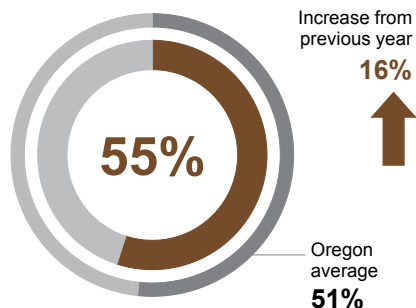

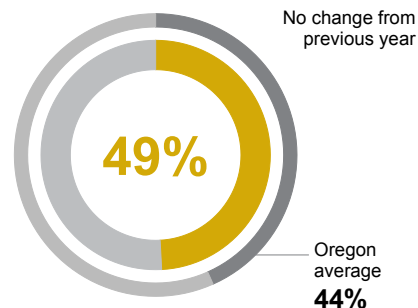
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

MATHEMATICS

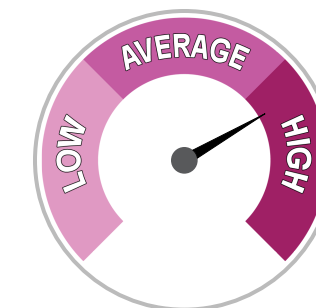
Students meeting state grade-level expectations.



Academic Progress

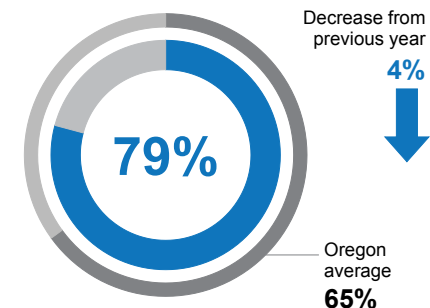
INDIVIDUAL STUDENT PROGRESS

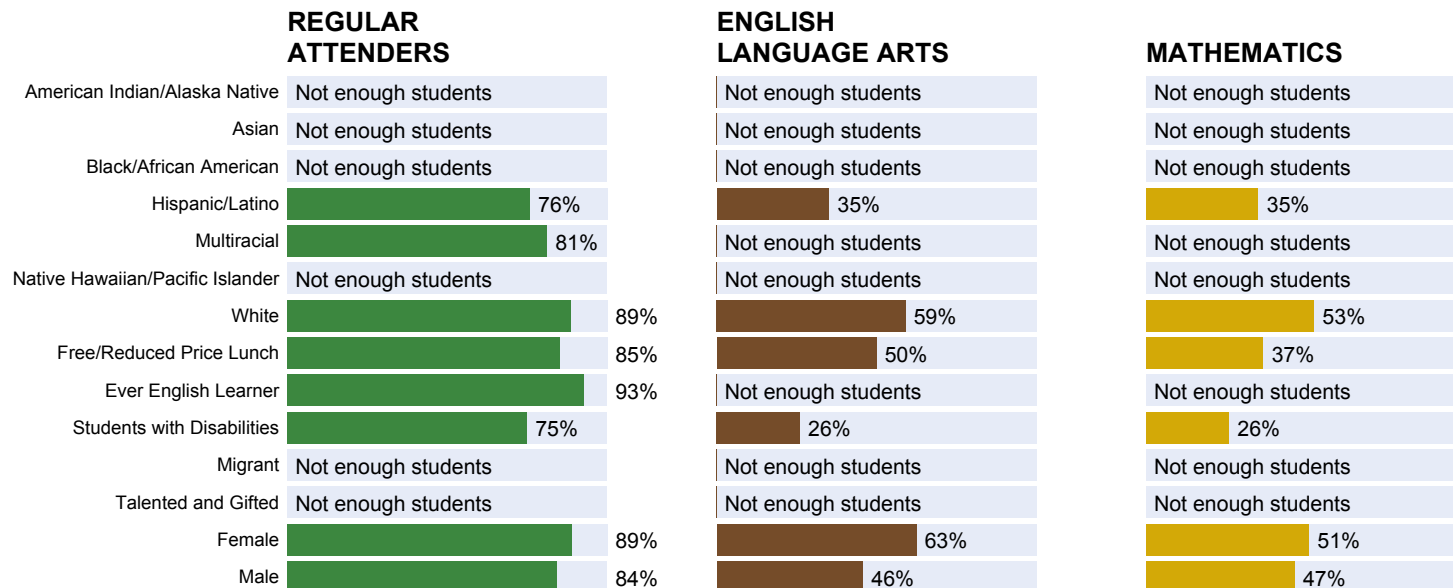
