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Elementary Return to Learn FAQ

In an effort to continuously keep families informed of the changing dynamics of the 2020-2021 school year, we've created a quick "cheat sheet" regarding our R2L plan. After our staff works through the

1. How far apart can you spread students out in the classroom?
 - a. Currently, we are only able to put approximately 2-3' between each desk. In rooms that we are able to spread desks apart farther, we have done so.
2. How will the lunchroom work?
 - a. Breakfast
 - i. Students in grades PK-1 will report to their classroom where teachers will request breakfast for those who need it. These students will have breakfast delivered to their rooms for the first month of school at a minimum.
 - ii. Students in grades 2-6 will check into their classroom and grab their breakfast to bring back to the classroom to eat.
 - b. Lunch
 - i. We will be running 4 lunch shifts in order to keep our classrooms together and assist with fewer students at recess.
 - ii. Students will not be going through the serving line. Staff members will bring trays to the students in the lunchroom.
 - iii. Classes will be sitting together at the tables (spaced out) with one table left empty between classes when possible.
3. What does Unpack the Backpack Night look like?
 - a. Unfortunately, we can't hold our "traditional" unpack the backpack night. We totally understand that each student will have a fair amount of materials to drop off at school and bringing them the first day of school may not work well.
 - b. This year, we will be hosting a **Drive Thru Unpack the Backpack night on Wednesday, August 19, 2020 from 2-6pm**. Parents can drop off student supplies in marked bags and we will deliver them to their room.
4. Can we tour the school before school starts?
 - a. Yes, we encourage you to come tour the school on Tuesday, August 18th at 5:00. If you are unable to attend the open house, please contact the elementary office and we can arrange a time for you to tour the building.
5. What will the enrichment part of the day look like from 12:30-3:30?
 - a. Students will be engaged art, music, gym, recess, study tables for older students, coding, small group interventions and various other activities.
 - b. We are trying as hard as possible to not mix classrooms together. We will try to do this to the best of our ability.
