INSTRUCTION

Instruction will begin on August 12 and may take place two ways: On-Campus Learning and At-Home Learning. Parent commitment for instruction format must be given no later than July 29 at 5:00 pm. Student's instructional format cannot be altered until the end of the entire six weeks grading period.

In an effort to prevent COVID-19 exposure, multiple modifications to the normal school day has been established.

	To accommodate parents that can no longer send their student on the bus, but must leave early for work, the school will open at 7:00 am.
Morning	All elementary students will enter the building through the cafeteria after a temperature check. Parents are asked to stay in their car and not leave until their student has been cleared to enter the building.
Morning Procedures	Secondary students that eat breakfast will enter through the cafeteria as well. Secondary students that do not eat breakfast will enter through the main high school entrance.
	After 7:30 AM: Elementary students may enter through cafeteria, or a parent may walk them to the main entrance.
	Secondary students may enter through cafeteria only if eating. All other secondary students must enter through main high school entrance.
	Face coverings will be required for staff when social distancing is not possible.
Masks	Face coverings are required for all visitors entering the building.
	Students are asked to wear face coverings.
	Cafeteria – All classes will eat in the cafeteria with social distancing present.
Shared Space Limitations	Library – Teachers and librarian will collaborate to set up appointments for the entire class to enter the library. Individual students will make book requests via a form, and the librarian will deliver them on a mobile cart.
	Playground – Students in grades PK-1 st will use playground equipment with sanitization between use. All students may use the practice field for recess activities and outdoor PE.



Shared Space Limitations	 Restrooms – Capacity with appropriate social distancing will be communicated to all students and staff. Those individuals waiting for the restroom will wait in the hallway using proper social distancing. Administrators and teachers will monitor bathrooms as much as possible to limit overcrowding. Hallways – Elementary students will transition in the hallway one grade level at a time. This means if 1st grade is in the hallway 2nd grade must wait to transition. Secondary students will stay to the far right of the hallway to maintain as much social distance as possible.
COVID-19 Symptoms or Exposure	 Should a person have symptoms of or lab-confirmed with COVID-19 they must meet ALL 3 of the following eligibility to return to campus: At least 1 day (24 hours) have passed since recovery (no fever without the use of fever reducing medications), and You have improved in respiratory symptoms (cough, shortness of breath, etc.), and At least 10 days have passed since symptoms first occurred Should a person determine they were in close contact with an individual who is lab-confirmed with COVID-19, they must remain off campus until the full 14-day incubation period has passed. Close contact includes being directly exposed to infectious secretions (e.g., being coughed on while not wearing a mask) or being within 6 ft for a duration of 15 minutes while not wearing a mask.
