Options for returning to school

2. At home learning to include virtual and paper/pencil resources delivered by Greenwood staff. (Plans developed with individual learners/families)

Seesaw or Google Classroom lessons

Grades 4K-2 Seesaw through GES staff



Staff Entering the building

Staff will complete at-home self assessment for health

Enter through Door 1 - Red Doors

Temperature check

- Peer rotation schedule for temp checks

- Automatic scanner will be mounted at doors 1 and 5



Buses - Morning Routine

Support staff located at each entrance

- Two at Door 1

- One at Door 5

- One at Angled Sidewalk (Door 4)

One bus unloads at a time

100 degree limit - send to office

Temperature good - Send to Breakfast or Classroom



Entering School in the Morning

Buses will drop at Door 1 **Starting at 7:40am**

All bused students will enter through Door 1

Students riding bikes will enter Door 1

Temperature checks upon entering school - Automated Thermometers

Support staff will monitor

Parent Drop Off or Walkers **Starting at 7:40am**

Students will enter through Door 5, the main office

Temperature checks upon entering school - Automated Thermometers

Support staff will monitor



Breakfast and Morning Locations

Students report directly to classrooms or breakfast

- Teachers will have to monitor students in classrooms
- Could have a video playing each morning?

Backpacks next to desks in grades 1-6 - normal for 4K/5K (Command Hooks)

All tables - space them out

Students must sit every other seat and staggered (not directly across from each other)

All students will drop off coats, backpacks, etc, in classroom, then go to breakfast.



Bathrooms and Bubblers

Bubblers will be turned off, bottle fillers will work

Limit number in bathroom to 3 at a time?

Water Bottles - Should be clear, all students will receive one at start of year

Bathrooms - Wash hands before and after you go



Hallways

Two way Halls - the middle red squares are the divider - Stay to the right

- Students need better trained to stay on the right.
- Not cut corners

Masks required in the halls



Recess - Playground

Students will have recess. They will be able to play, we just have to make sure they are not touching/grabbing each other. (Masks are optional)

Cannot use balls while Clark County is in High Risk Zone

Organize grade levels to spread out the social groupings

Sanitize hands when re-enter the building

Line up physically distanced at grade level doors



Morning Recess

9:45-10:00 Grades 4K, 1, and 3

10:05-10:20 Grades 5K, 2, and 5

10:25-10:40 Grades 4 and 6

Supervised by support staff



Classroom Supplies

No community supplies - If there is a shared resource, they will need sanitized after each use.

Each child has their own art box

Plan to take art box to specials



Lunchroom - Lunch Cycle

11:05-11:30 - 4K, 1, 3 (56 Students)

Recess - 11:30-11:55

11:35-12:00 - 5K, 2, 5 (63 Students)

Recess - 12:00-12:25

12:05-12:30 - 4, 6 (46 Students)

Recess - 12:30-12:55

***Indoor recess due to weather will be in the classroom with the teacher.

***Students will line up at assigned doors, as in the past, preparing for recess dismissal.

***Students will wear masks to and from the lunch room, but are not required to wear them while eating.

- Students sit every other seat and staggered (Not directly across from each other)
- Tables will be sprayed between lunch groups - (One minute dwell time)
- Students will wash/sanitize hands when entering the lunch line



Library

- Classroom delivery 4K-1; one grade per day to use the library 2-6
- 2-6 students can use Destiny to place holds anytime. Those books will be delivered to students. (They will need to be taught how.)
- Library return crates in each classroom. Students return their books to those crates, Lori will pick up all crates on Friday afternoons. Books will sit over the weekend, be checked in on Mondays, cleaned and shelved after that.
- Masks and hand sanitizer when entering the library.
- Plexiglass safety shield at the check out desk
- Visual cues will be used to help provide students with a visual for social distancing (line up spots on floor, sit spots on carpet, etc.)
- Tables will be spaced out and chairs only on one side, all facing the same direction.
- Shelf markers will not be used. New method taught of using the neighbor book.
- No makerspace items available



Classroom Libraries

As a part of the [REopening Archives, Libraries, and Museums \(REALM\) Project](#), scientists have found that the virus SARS-CoV-2 that causes COVID-19 is not detectable on five common library materials after three days.

Have return bin for classroom library materials and reshelve them after the weekend?

Can students have only one bin/bag? Can they have the same books in their bin that they take home in their blue bag? I worry about quantity.

ARC Bookshelf - Likely purchased with SchoolPace this year. This will give students access to several online titles.



Art

Masks will need to be required in the art room, due to the size of the room. Materials will still need to be individual as much as possible. Any community supplies will need to be sanitized regularly with the appropriate dwell time between users.

5K-1 Two 30 minute sessions weekly

2-6 One 45 minute session weekly



Music

6th Grade Band will be postponed until January. This will give us more time to figure out how to safely do fittings and whether or not we can structure lessons safely.

General Music will occur with two-30 minute sessions each week. Music can be outside while weather permits. Adequate spacing is possible. Shared instruments will be off limits for now.

Grades 5K-6 Two 30 minute sessions weekly

4K - One 30 minute session weekly



Phy Ed

Outside when possible

Cannot share manipulatives

More individual activities

Any items used will have to be adequately sanitized between use, with the appropriate dwell time to kill germs

5K-6 Three 30 minute sessions weekly

4K One 30 minute session weekly



Office

Temperature check upon entering.

Attendance/lunch count online via Skyward. Students will be able to check in when they arrive to their classroom in the morning.

Announcements - Announcements will be video/online

Parents - Require masks for any parents entering the building

Door handles will have to be wiped/sprayed frequently.



Chromebooks

- Change charging situation so that Chromebooks are ready to go home when needed - the chargers need to be accessible. Chromebooks should come to school charged each day.
- Digital citizenship lessons will be taught frequently, from multiple teachers (Mrs. Green, classroom teachers, Ms. Keech, etc.)
- Replacement Chromebooks checked out through the library when a student's device is out for repair.

Special Education - Speech and Language

Face shields and clear masks will be available

Plexiglass dividers

Need the ability to work side by side

IEPs will be followed and teams will meet to make any necessary adjustments



Mental Health and Wellness

- Students may feel generalized anxiety about COVID-19 and stressors related to quarantine/summer break, please remind them that these feelings are normal and valid
- Ms. Keech's schedule will have her in district most days, but some of her classes may require attendance at Stout.
- Disinfect fidget toys/desk after each student
- County mental health referrals are still going; not sure about their process for meeting students

Take time daily to talk with students about their feelings on safety and be ready to listen without judging. There will likely be many different perspectives and all are ok.



Title Services

Mrs. Schlough will start Title I services within the first couple weeks.

Mrs. Schlough will be available to help with IRLA work and Seesaw logging in for the younger kids.



4 Year Old Kindergarten

There will not be Friday classes for these kiddos. We will revisit this for second semester, starting in January.

The Monday/Wednesday and Tuesday/Thursday groups will still meet full days!



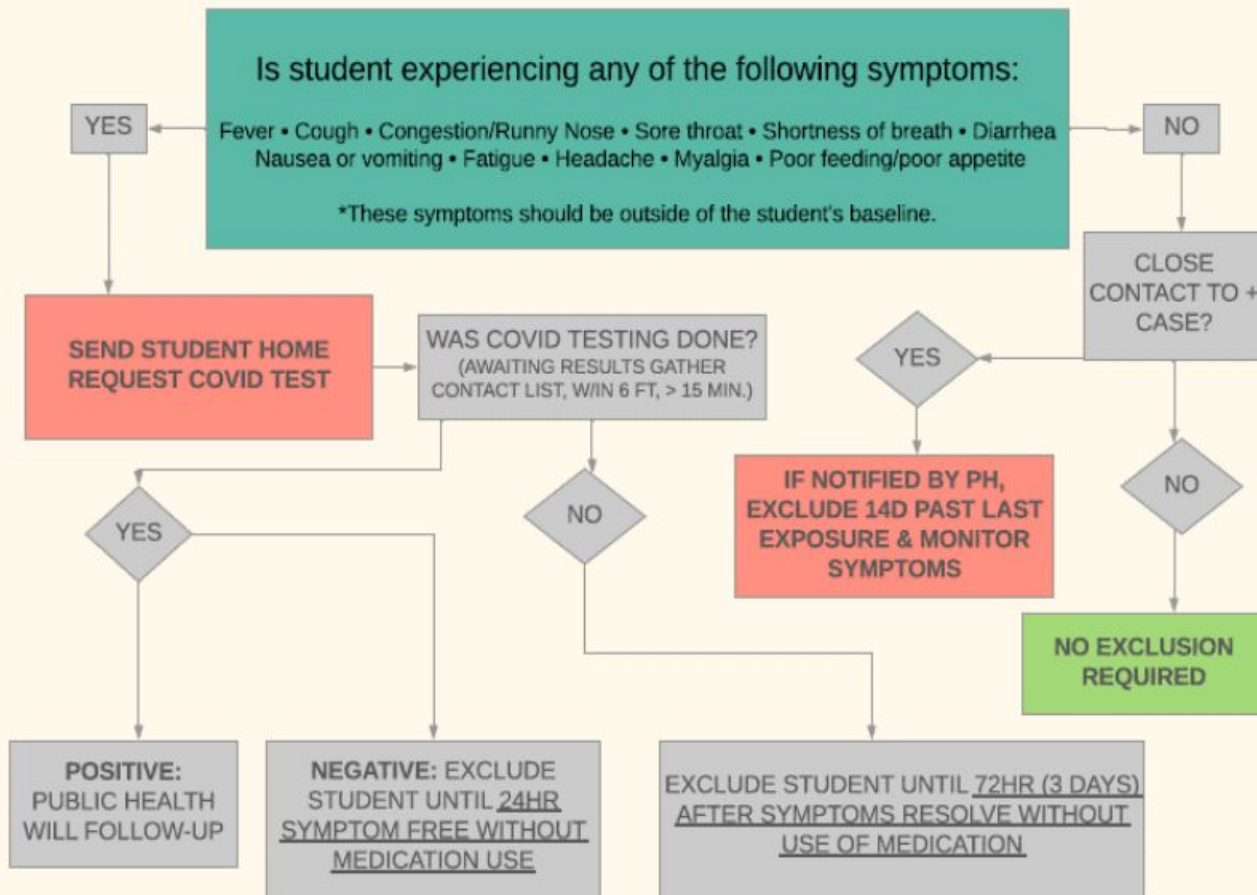
Handling Sickness

Fever 100+ automatically goes home - quarantined in office conference room

Students showing other signs of illness should be referred to the office also.

Getting to know your kids and families will be crucial. Some kids have allergies and coughs that never, ever seem to go away.





Ill Household Members:

COVID positive household: PH will determine "close contacts" and exclude as appropriate, typically this will be 14D since last "exposure" from ill individual.

COVID negative/unknown household: all "well" individuals are able to attend school as usual.



End of Day Procedures - Pickup time

School ends at 3:10pm

Buses, walkers, bikers will load first, leave at 3:15pm

Buses will pull up to Division St.

Parent pick-ups, will wait in classroom until buses depart. (Approximately 3:20pm)

Parents can pick up on Division St. or wait for the buses to leave, then pull up

When buses leave, teachers will walk parent pick up students out.



General Mask Guidelines

Masks required while indoors - in accordance with the Governor's order

Masks can be removed for eating, drinking, or to comply with medical directive

Take frequent water breaks - encourage drinking more water

Take breaks outside when weather permits

Parents - Please practice mask wearing with your kids. Your positive attitude about wearing masks will have a huge impact on our kids' attitude about wearing one at school.



Cleaning/Disinfecting

All table/desk surfaces will be disinfected at lunch time and end of each day

Door handles will be sprayed nightly and disinfected throughout the day

Lunch tables will be cleaned between each lunch group, with appropriate dwell time for cleaning agents to work

All soap/sanitizer stations will be touchless as well as hand towels

Regular routines to wash/sanitize hands

Unnecessary furniture removed
