Description:

This is the year of self-discovery! Students will learn about others through non-fiction reading and through their own research. Students will prepare for the SAT through practices and class activities and assignments. Students will explore careers and post-secondary school options.

Goals:

Students will look at careers and post-secondary schools. They will get to meet with some military and college personnel. The theme for English 11 is Self Discovery: A Study in Perspective Students will write more business/professional style. This course will require them to incorporate textual evidence and research into their work. Prompt writing will be required, to prepare for the SAT and for college writing. Students will read non-fiction writing and will discuss and read dystopian literature.

We will continue to work on grammar and mechanics for real-world use. Students will have the opportunity for more stylistic writing and some writing 'rule' breaking as appropriate.
