Wildcat Classrooms

- All classrooms will have a permanent seating chart.
- Where social distancing cannot be maintained, clear dividers will be used.
- Staff will wear masks where a distance of six feet cannot be maintained.
- MS and HS students will wear masks in the hallways and entering/exiting the building.

Wildcat Academics

- All classrooms/subject areas will focus on essential standards.
- Building counselors and the District social worker will provide social-emotional support.
- Elementary students will stay with cohort groups.
- All electives will be offered.

Wildcat Meal Services

- Breakfast and lunch will be served.
- Meals will be served in the cafeteria, classrooms, and other locations.
- Students will be able to bring their own lunch if desired.

Wildcat Transportation

- Parents/guardians are encouraged to provide transportation.
- Bus capacity will be limited to maintain social distancing standards.
- Students will be assigned seats according to family groups.
- Buses will be sanitized after each route.

Wildcat Cleaning and Sanitation

- The District will increase sanitation of high traffic areas throughout the school day.
- Water fountains have been disabled; bottle fillers have been placed in all buildings.
- Additional hand washing stations have been installed as well as additional hand sanitizers have been placed around campus.

Wildcat Mitigation

- Campus will not be open until 7:35 each day, and students will report directly to their homeroom or 1st hour class.
- The District will follow guidance from the Stoddard County Health Department, the State of Missouri, the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE), Missouri State High School Activities Association (MSHSAA), and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC.)
