

A. Background: Covid-19 Response

1. Immediate Covid Response: Please describe how your school or network responded, operationally, to covid-19 in the spring. When did schools close? How did you proceed with meal distribution, communications, and technology needs? Please share any lessons learned or persistent challenges.

Camden's Promise Charter School had begun to plan for a temporary virtual school day in the 2017-2018 school year. The focus at the time was on the ability to hold virtual school days during snow days and summer programs. Infrastructure, one-to-one capacity, and backbone staffing was steadily developed over the next few school years. Over the summer of 2019, a small virtual program was piloted. Items learned from that pilot were carried into the school year in the areas of professional development and program platform development. The intent during this past year was to finalize Online Learning Systems by grade spans, to continue to pilot in an expanded fashion, and to host fully virtual programs during the summer of 2020 with the intent to host virtual snow days in the 2020-2021 school year.

The Camden's Promise Virtual Academy Program was launched on March 17, 2020. The school's marking period ended and Spring break commenced on April 9. 2020. The intent upon student's March exodus was to treat the two and a half week period as an opportunity for intensive virtual professional development for staff and students and as a test of prior developed infrastructure and protocols for a fully online learning environment. Academic focus was on finishing out the marking period and getting every child to participate and learn in both synchronous and asynchronous classes. Social and Emotionally, students were assigned specific mentors (homeroom teachers, deans, team leaders, guidance counselors, etc) who were responsible for daily check-ins with students.

As spring break approached, it began to be apparent that the school year would continue in an on-line fashion for the remainder of the school year. The school's administrative team worked throughout spring break to modify the existing educational program requirements by grade-span and rolled out a 4th marking period plan upon student return. As the 4th marking period progressed, the school made concerted efforts to maintain connections with students and their families. The assigned

mentors, became first responders in areas of social, health and emotional needs of our students and families. The school focus shifted from strictly academic to also focusing on maintaining community, a sense of connection with our students, families and faculty.

Camden's Promise partnered with the Camden City School District to host two meal distribution sites for breakfast and lunch available to any Camden City student. Additionally, Camden's Promise continued to host, in partnership with the SJ Food Bank, a monthly communitywide foodbank on the third Saturday of each month which serves over 170 Camden families. Communication was coordinated through three means. Schoolwide communications were distributed through social media, robocalls, and distributed videos. Gradespan communications (elementary, middle, and high school) were distributed through daily announcements, robocalls, and Canvas/Google messaging. Classroom communications were distributed by individual teachers through online learning platforms. The technology team became essential employees and staffed servers, online help and maintained chromebooks through on-site appointments.

Throughout the process the Camden's Promise Charter School community grew together in leaps and bounds. While the 2020 school year can be considered an academic success, persistent needs still exist. The school does continue to struggle with ensuring: all students have on-line access at all times; a sufficient stock of readily available swap-out chromebooks for distribution while original devices are being maintained is available; the school has the capacity to meet the true social and emotional needs that are being developed through continued isolation, that real data is being utilized and tracked to drive improvement of program.

2. Technology Access: Do your students have access to devices at home? Internet? Please share any lessons learned on remote instruction at home.

As part of the school's one-to-one program, all Camden's Promise Charter School students do have access to chromebooks. Based on schoolwide survey results, all students have access to internet. In reality though, there are times that chromebooks become nonfunctional, and there are temporary losses in internet access. These temporary losses in student connection to the school are compounded in an online learning environment where there is a lack of extended learning opportunities to relearn and reinforce concepts.

3. Remote Learning: Please share how your network has approached remote instruction. If schools are using technology, is learning synchronous or asynchronous? What platforms are being used? How are participation and mastery tracked and responded to?

Camden's Promise Charter School has utilized a chromebook based Virtual Academy model. Grades spans K-4 utilize Google classrooms. Grades 5-12 utilize Canvas, Google classrooms, and Zoom. Courses combine both synchronous and asynchronous components. Participation and mastery are tracked and reinforced by individual teachers and monitored by grade-level advisors. Grades are maintained in the school's RealTime student database.

4. Socioemotional Support: Please share how your network has supplemented academic instruction. If students are receiving calls, from whom and with what frequency? If not, what alternate methods of communication are being used?

While the goal of maintaining daily contact is the same throughout the school, it was handled differently at each grade span. All effort was coordinated by grade span Principals. Each grade span had at their disposal a minimum of two social workers and a school nurse. At the Kindergarten through 4th span, daily contact was with the student's homeroom teacher. Grades 5-8 also maintained homeroom contact but added in an additional team leader daily oversight and weekly contact. Grades 9-12 maintained student daily check in with at least one core class per day. All administrators were assigned a group of 60 students to "mentor" through the pandemic. Mentoring included daily check-ins for assignment completion and health and wellness. Schoolwide activities such as daily announcements, theme days, afterschool programs and award events were managed through central administration. All contact was through Student Online Learning systems, robocalls, and social media. Home visits were made when necessary.

5. Supporting Students with Diverse Needs: What steps has your network taken to support students with special needs and students receiving ELL services at this time? What challenges remain?

Camden's Promise Charter School maintains a full child study team, special education department, and ELL staff. Under the guidance of the CST director, all programs and services, included specialized services such as speech and OT were mobilized and provided on-line. All CST meetings were held with parents via Zoom. While services were provided, like with general education students, it is realized that a gap in potential learning was created through the Virtual Academy as compared to traditional instruction. The CST/ELL department is actively working to benchmark student growth and develop a plan to maximize CARES act funding to supplement instruction in the 2020-2021 school year.

B. Fall Planning & Proposed Use of Grant Funds

1. Planning: Please describe how your network is approaching planning for school reopening in the fall. Include any phases of decision-making, plan development, communication, and implementation.

The planning process for fall reopening is governed by three main factors: The State regulations, the Camden City reopening task force, and the Camden's Promise Charter School charter. State regulations will provide the backbone requirements for opening, including social distancing guidelines. The Camden City task force will work to standardize general practices such as transportation and food service necessary to maintain a health and wellness safety net across the city. The Camden's Promise charter will help the school to keep a focus on maintaining its mission and levels of academic success throughout the process.

Members of the school's Pandemic Response Team are consistently in contact with State and City task force members. It is their responsibility to articulate necessary actions required by those groups to the general team. With the recent release of the State plan, the Response Team is moving from reflection to planning stage. Operating requirements are being standardized across grade spans. Individual grade span principals will work with their administrative team and parent groups to actualize an opening plan within the regulations. Plans will be communicated to staff through summer zoom meetings. Plans will be communicated to families through zoom meetings with pre-existing families and

through small group individual meetings with new families. As per state guidelines, the plan will be submitted and approved by the State in August, at-least two weeks prior to opening.

2. Intended Use: Identify potential areas where the grant funds may be utilized. Describe any considerations, internal or external, that would help you decide with certainty how funds will be used.

Camden's Promise Charter School intends to use this grant to supplement three areas: Operational, Academic, and Socioemotional Learning. These identified areas are based on realized need for improvement from the spring program. Areas of focus for this grant were also chosen because it is believed the efforts through this grant will be Camden centric and the outcomes and efforts of the grant can be shared with the general Camden reopening task force. CARES Act funding will also be utilized to strengthen the school's reopening plan and the funds allocated through that grant will focus on areas not identified within this grant proposal.

At this point, the school's plan is to offer a hybrid program. This program will attempt to provide the most on-site learning time as possible but will continue to offer a level of virtual instruction. The program will be developed in a way to either increase contact time or possibly decrease contact time as health parameters dictate.

Specifically the grant funds will be utilized as indicted below.

Category	Use
Operational	Focus will be placed on professionally developing and empowering the Pandemic Response Team. The utilization of data collection and analysis will be central to this process. Data will help to identify areas of health and wellness needs, academic gaps, and both struggling and excelling populations. Opportunities to learn and share within the Camden and greater community will be provided and encouraged to further the citywide educational growth.
Academic	Additional Chromebooks will be purchased to serve as swap-out devices while student assigned chromebooks are being maintained. This was found to be necessary as refurbishment timelines were extended during the pandemic.
	Additional Hot Spots will be purchased to serve as backups for city-wide hot spots. With the move to global on-line learning, areas of the city that maintained consistent drops or weak coverage were identified on a rolling basis. The deployment of additional hot spots will help supplement these drop zones.

	These measures will result in the decrease in lost learning opportunities.
Socioemotional Learning	Professional development will strengthen exiting trauma informed care and PBIS programs. Grant funds will assist the school in developing and implementing programs that focus on the whole family. A focus will be placed on community building and allowing students and staff to maintain their voice and direction in a hybrid program environment.

Reopening plans will be driven by the Camden's Promise Charter School Pandemic Response Team. The response team led by the Camden's Promise lead person consists of key staff from across the school including Academic, Support, Business, and Administrative personnel. The team works in coordination with grade-span Principals who manage building wide planning and implementation groups. Members of the Pandemic Response Team work within the Camden City reopening task force to assist in coordination and communication of citywide health and wellness initiatives..

Camden's Promise Charter School will focus on three main areas in the fall.

Area 1: Physical health and safety of the school community

The Pandemic Response Team will be responsible for utilizing real data to continually evaluate and improve the school's response during changing health parameters. Focus will be on maintaining the physical health and safety of all members of the school community as the school's first priority. The team will coordinate the school's efforts with the City and State initiatives and will be responsible for the communication of all activities.

Area 2: Academic Success

Individual grade-span principals will work within the parameters instituted by the Pandemic Response Team to maximize every child's potential for learning. A focus on cohort tracking and scheduling will be utilized to provide instruction in a dynamic hybrid model. Equity and inclusion will be a priority to ensure all students are engaged in the learning process.

Area 3: Maintaining Social and Emotional wellness

Community building will included in all efforts. Camden's Promise staff and culture will ensure no student becomes invisible. Daily check-ins will continue to be maintained. The school will utilize the hybrid environment to strengthen virtual touchpoints and identify both signs of concern and strength. School-wide Socioemotional response teams will be mobilized to monitor and implement plans to meet the needs of emerging effects of the Pandemic. As always, Camden's Promise will seek to unite and celebrate the student, family and staff accomplishments throughout the process.

C. Outcomes

1. Success: What does a successful reopening look like for your network?

All members of the school community are informed and prepared to participate in the Fall 2020 hybrid model. The Pandemic Response Team has established operating protocols that maximize school community health and safety. Response plans to changing health parameters are available and are easily transferable. Grade-span teams have actualized the Response Team requirements into appropriately grouped academic cohorts to maximize learning. Learning will build on items gained in the prior year and smaller class sizes and effectively teamed virtual elements will expedite learning. Technology resources and infrastructure is strengthened to limit lost learning time. The school community is vibrant and connected. Students, staff and families do not feel a sense of loss from historical program structures but are excited to participate and embrace a new learning model. Within the learning model every child has an individualized learning plan but undertakes it in a supportive, family-based communal environment.

Principals will work with the technology staff and individual families to ensure students have consistent access when participating in the virtual component. A detailed tracking of zones of lost internet coverage and computer downtimes will be maintained and reported.

Goal 3 efforts will be monitored school-wide by the Pandemic Response Team. Grade span programs will be enacted by school-level Socioemotional Learning teams and governed by grade span Principals. Programs will be flexible to identify and celebrate unique features and needs of individual schools and students.
