<b>RED:</b> Substantial uncontrolled transmission	25+ daily new cases per 100,000 people	<u>Unchecked Community Spread</u> - There is large scale uncontrolled community transmission including communal setting	Stay-at-home orders are necessary	Grandview will: move to an all virtual setting.
<b>ORANGE:</b> Substantial controlled transmission	10-24 daily new cases per 100,000 people	<u>Escalating Community Spread</u> - Large scale controlled community transmission, including communal setting	Stay-at-home orders may be necessary, unless it's possible to surge testing and tracing capabilities	Grandview will: Require face coverings on buses and during transition times and lunches will be eaten in the classroom. Students will be allowed to remove face coverings while behind barriers in the classroom.
<b>YELLOW:</b> Minimal to moderate community transmission	1-9 daily new cases per 100,000 people	<u>Potential Community Spread</u> - Sustained transmission with high likelihood or confirmed exposure within communal settings and potential for rapid increase in cases	Continue testing, contact tracing and isolation, recommended face coverings, social distancing, and other measures.	Grandview will: Recommend all students and staff wear face coverings, but they are not required. Students will eat in the cafeteria and will be allowed to remove face coverings behind barriers..
<b>GREEN:</b> No to minimal community transmission	<1 daily new cases per 100,000 people	<u>Close to Containment</u> - Evidence of isolated cases of limited community transmission, case investigations underway, no evidence of exposure in large setting.	Continue testing, contact tracing and isolation to suppress outbreaks	Grandview will: Allow all students and staff wear face coverings, but they are not required. Students will eat in the cafeteria. Barriers will remain in place.

**Required under all Levels:** Frequent Hand Washing/Sanitizing - Social Distancing (when possible) - Cover Coughs and Sneezes - Frequent Cleaning or High Touch Areas - Everyone should Monitor their Health Daily
