

Milton-Union Revenue Per Pupil




Building Operations Spending Per Pupil

Elementary

As one of Ohio Ready Schools the elementary is providing a safe and prepared learning environment for all K—5 students. We continue to offer all-day everyday kindergarten and are increasing the amount of STEM instructional time for students. We are working with Wright State University to increase the number of problem based learning opportunities for all students.

Middle School

Middle School students have the opportunity to participate in Spanish 1, 10 fine art electives, 2 HS math options, 20 electives and approximately 45% of the student body are enrolled in accelerated courses.

High School

The class of 2017 received over \$1,600,000 in scholarship opportunities and achieved a 92.9% graduation rate. We continue to increase our agriculture and business course opportunities as well as robotics. All eleventh grade students participated in the administration of the SATSAT and as a district we continue to focus on pathways to meet each student's needs.



Student Services



Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) allows for clear language for expected behaviors, acknowledgement of appropriate choices and strategies for those who need additional support.



Response to intervention (RTI) is another set of data that is used to determine the appropriate level of instruction for individual students. The RTI process monitors the student's progress and uses that information to revise intervention strategies.



Head Start and Preschool programs serve 3 to 5 year old's. Each offers additional time for skill development to better prepare kindergarten students for school.



