



Springport Public Schools Safe Return to School Roadmap



Together, as a community, we will meet the challenges of three scenarios that will exemplify our continued commitment to providing a rigorous and total educational experience for all Springport students. To help with understanding exactly what instruction and learning will be during any of the 6 Phases in which Michigan schools find themselves opening for students, I felt it necessary to provide this back to school 2020-2021 information:

PreK-12 Instruction and Learning Models (Phase 4-5)

- Students in grades 6-12 will have 2 options: in-person Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday and virtual on Wednesday (4 + 1 Model) or 100% virtual Monday – Friday.
- Students in grades PreK-5 will have 2 options: in-person Monday – Friday or 100% virtual Monday – Friday

Changing Instruction and Learning Models

- Students in grades 6-12 have until the end of the 2nd week of school (Friday, Sept. 4) to change their minds. They also may change at the end of each marking period. Parents must contact the principal at least 1 week ahead of time.
- Students in grades PreK-5 have until the end of the 2nd week of school (Friday, Sept. 4) to change their minds. They also may change at the midpoint of each marking period. Parents must contact the principal at least 1 week ahead of time.

Facial Coverings

- All PreK-12 students will be required to wear a face covering while riding on a school bus, walking in hallways, using the restrooms, and whenever being in a group large enough that social distancing is not practical, unless a medically exempt form is completed by a health care professional and on file with the office in the school building the student attends.
- Students in grades PreK-5 will not be required to wear a face covering while in their classroom.
- Students in grades 6-12 will be required to wear a face covering at all times while on campus except in PE class, while eating meals in the cafeteria, or during outdoor activities where social distancing is possible.

Technology

- K-12 students may have the opportunity to use a school provided device for virtual instruction and learning. K-12 students may also have the option of using their personal device for learning.

Transportation

- All PreK-12 students will be required to wear a face covering while riding on a school bus, unless a medically exempt form is completed by a health care professional and on file with the office in the school building the student attends.
- Hand sanitizer stations will be available on all buses. Students must sanitize their hands upon entering the bus.
- Buses will be cleaned between each run after all students have exited.
- Disposable face coverings will be available at the bus entrance for students who forget theirs.

Visitors

- Only essential visitors will be allowed in buildings.
- Visitors must wear a face covering at all times.
- Non-essential visitors will not be allowed past the building office.
- Non-essential visitors will be limited to members of 1 family at a time in the building office.
- Please don't enter any school building or attend any school related event if you are exhibiting the following symptoms:
fever, chills, cough, shortness of breath, sore throat, muscle pain, loss of smell or taste
