SAT, PSAT 10 & PSAT 9

In April, high school students take a standardized test designed to assess whether a student is "on-track" for being prepared for college, post-high school training, and career readiness. The results of the test will be available by that fall or sooner.

ASVAB

10th and 12th grade students will take the ASVAB career aptitude test in October. The results will be shared with students to help identify potential career pathways based on strengths.
