

2020 Remote and Blended Remote Learning Plan

Updated: August 3, 2020

Health & Wellness

- Staff, students/parents and visitors are required to self-certify that they are free of symptoms before entering the school building.
- Face coverings will be required by all individuals while in the building and while riding on the bus.
- Students will be required to be at least 6 feet away from each other. The classroom will be arranged so that this can be accomplished.
- Students will stay in classrooms and the teachers will rotate to the students. Hallway use will be limited.
- Students will eat in the lunchroom and will be socially distanced from one another.
- All surfaces in the school will be cleaned and disinfected frequently.
- Students will not share items and will have their own remote device and supplies.
- Hand sanitation areas have increased and will be close to every classroom. Teachers will have sanitation supplies in every classroom and will encourage hand washing throughout the school day.
- Transportation will be limited to 50 students per bus. Students/parents are required to self-certify that they are free of symptoms before entering the school bus. The buses will be sanitized before and after each route.
- Students will be asked to bring their own water bottle to school. Water fountains will not be accessible to students.
- There will be a designated area for students exhibiting COVID-19 symptoms that is away from the general population. Parents will be contacted.
- Office staff will be expected to obtain specific information about illness from parents/guardians when absences are being reported. Information will be recorded and shared with the school nurse and appropriate personnel, ensuring the privacy of the student.

Instruction



In-Person Learning

- Students will be in school 5 days a week from 8:00 am - 1:45 pm. This includes 5 hours of instructional time.
- Students will have instruction in all subjects throughout the week. There will be an emphasis on English Language Arts and Mathematics.
- Students will remain in class and teachers will rotate to the classrooms.
- Teachers will schedule mask breaks and take students outside when possible.
- Students in need of interventions because of skill deficits will be provided with an instructional plan.
- Students with an Individualized Education Plan will be provided the supportive instruction based on their plan.
- Students will have PE class that will be held outdoors if feasible (no locker rooms or changing clothes).
- Music classes will utilize outdoor spaces with 10 ft distancing.
- Time will be dedicated for building relationships and developing a classroom culture.
- Academics may focus on student engagement and interactivity through inquiry-based and project-based learning.
- Traditional grading procedures and grades will be used regardless of a student receiving instruction remotely or in-person. Parents need to notify the teacher as soon as possible of any concerns with assignments.

Remote Learning

- Any student who opts for Remote Learning will stay in Remote Learning for the first semester.
- Teachers will give students participating in remote learning instruction a suggested daily schedule for their virtual learning.
- Students will get their class resources and assignments through Google Classroom (3-8) and/or See Saw (K-2).
- All students in K-5th grade will be assigned to a teacher.
- The curriculum taught will mirror In-Person Learning as much as possible.
- Daily attendance, check-in and engagement with the virtual lessons and instruction will be required. Parents will be expected to communicate with the teacher any concerns with remote learning, so the teacher can work with the parent to remedy the concerns.
- Remote Learning Days will consist of 2.5 hours a day and will include a combination of instruction and school work and will follow the District's curriculum, using a balance of teacher recorded lessons, textbooks/worksheets and digital instruction.
- The remote learning day will consist of at least 2.5 hours per day of virtual learning with real-time instruction and live interaction between the student and their teacher.
- Learning activities may include, but are not limited to, the teacher delivering instruction via recorded video through Zoom or other virtual platforms, independent/flexible student work time, and virtual/telephone teacher-student check-ins.
- All class assignments are required/expected to be turned in through the specified online platform just as they would in class. Traditional grading procedures and grades will be used regardless of a student receiving instruction remotely or in-person. Parents need to notify the teacher as soon as possible of any concerns with assignments.
- Students in need of interventions because of skill deficits will be provided with an instructional plan.
- Students with an Individualized Education Plan will be provided the supportive instruction based on their plan.
- Students will be assigned and required to use a District issued Chromebook. If a WiFi Hotspot is necessary, the district will provide one. Dates will be set for supply pickup, so that students can receive any technology, textbooks/workbooks and other supplies necessary to engage in virtual learning.
