beginning July 1, 2020, ending June 30, 2023, would be Kristin Schmutzler with 1,257 votes. Second most votes for a three-year term would be Jeff Thorp with 928 votes. The other two candidates who ran, their tally Dennis R. Atkinson 875 votes and J. Mario Peña with 761.

- Oldenburg:** Ok, I would like to go through a few things with the group here tonight. First of all, I'd like to recognize Mrs. Misner for her 9 years of service to the school district. Thank you for your leadership and willingness to serve and you certainly leave a fingerprint on our district for many years of service and support of students. You always had students in the forefront of your mind in decision-making through the years that I've work with you, Mrs. Misner and I wish you a lot of health and happiness and thank you for all that you've done for the school system. I'd also like to take a moment to recognize and congratulate Mrs. Schmutzler and Mr. Thorp for winning terms to serve and I'd also like to recognize Mr. Pena and Mr. Atkinson for their willingness to join the team. We're blessed to have a team of individuals who continually work towards the goals of the district and to support the needs of our students and Mrs. Schmutzler and Mr. Thorp, I know are confident in their leadership and their ability to continue to move this district forward so we look forward to the next school year and I'm grateful for their willingness to serve. I also would like to recognize Mrs. Maxwell for all of her work through these extremely difficult

and ever changing times regarding the preparation for this vote. The absentee changes, the date changes and everything leading up to just an hour before this very meeting where she was running around and making sure that this whole process was extremely planned, organized and logistically able for us to hold this meeting here tonight, so Dana thank you very much for all that you've done. I'd certainly like to recognize Donna Hill and her team in the business office for their work and preparation on and about the budget. Obviously, when the community comes out like this and supports the furthering of our work, it's a testament to a lot of different areas of the organization, but today it's especially sweet for the business office and their planning, preparation and foresight to put our district in the position it continues to deliver high class services to the diverse student population so I'm certainly grateful for that. As you know, we finished the school calendar just this past Friday and our ten-month teaching staff will be finishing their calendar year this later on this week but I do want to recognize our support and maintenance staff, engineers, cleaners and a whole bunch of other people who work for us that have done excellent work through this COVID period, through these recent weeks as we continue to maintain our facilities and provide opportunities for students to retrieve items, to be delivered items, to support with food service and a whole bunch of other requirements as we work to meet the needs of our families these extremely unusual times. I want to thank that group. Certainly, our teachers have done a tremendous job. They jumped off the diving board straight away into a virtual learning scenario, they did it with high marks, professionalism and a lot of care for our students and I'd be remiss if this year comes to an end if I didn't recognize their dedication, service and hard work. I'd also like to mention that our administrative team, too, was working every single day here often times in the office, was trying to figure out the executive orders as they're being sent out on a day by day basis and did a lot to support all of our employees here as they worked to support our students and our families. At this time, I'd like to allow some of our building principals and administrators to speak about our retirees that have retired during this year and some that will be retiring effective June 30th. Patty Truskey has worked in Tonawanda for 30 years as a teaching assistant, Diane Sharry has been a teacher for 20 years coming back after she was done raising her children and Catherine Vitello has been with us in education for 34 years. The students, the staff and the community are greatly going to miss them and it's a big loss for us, but we wish them the best of luck and nothing but happiness and relaxation in their next adventure.

Oldenburg: Thanks, Diana. Amy, you're up.

Edgerton: I am recognizing John Streeter, I'd like to thank John for his service, first as a lifeguard and then a custodian. He loves our Tonawanda community and you can always wave to him near the high school where he often walks by with his dog. Next is Gail Walter. She has been a nurse in the middle school/high school her humor and knowledge were well balanced and allowed her to work with that middle school high school population in a professional manner. Thankfully she's agreed to sub for us and train our new nursing staff. And finally, Gary Bisone. And Gary was Gail's partner in the middle school high school nursing program and he took pride in knowing all the students and would work at the after party for the prom every year.

Oldenburg: Thanks, Amy. Michelle will be next.

Siebert: I'm recognizing three of our beloved staff members at Fletcher. First is Karen Burgett who currently is a 5th grade teacher in our ICT room. Karen advocates for her students on a regular basis and is dedicated educator. She has touched the lives of many of our students and families here at Tonawanda City. She'll be greatly missed and we wish her well in the next chapter of her life. We have 2 TA's also retiring. Actually, Deb Mileham. She's known as Ma Deb to the staff here at Fletcher. She fills many roles, depending on the needs we have but they range from working in our office, doing some clerical work, making copies, working with students and our staff directly. She's going to be greatly missed. She is definitely well loved by students here and she's kind of the glue that kind of makes sure kids do well in transition between 4th and 5th grade. And finally, I'd like to recognize Sharry Folmsbee.. She did retire at the end of January, so we've been missing her for a few months now, but she too is a TA.

She's worked in our self-contained classrooms helping students meet their needs, both in the special ed classroom and then being with them in the gen ed setting as well so we also with Sharry and Debbie much happiness in their next chapter in their lives as well.

Patty on behalf of the high school, we want to thank you for your dedication and service for our students. You always put students first and always did what was in their best interest. Your leadership with our school climate was truly unprecedented, you always went above and beyond. We hope you enjoy every moment of your retirement and we wish you only the best in years to come. Both of these educators will be missed at the high school, so like I said, we really do wish them only the best in their retirement. Thank you.

Next is Deanna O'Brocta. Deanna dedicated over 20 years to Tonawanda City School District. Deanna's biggest asset was she was always putting students first. Whenever she was given a new assignment or task, she not only excelled, she made it better for the students, faculty and staff. The last couple years she headed up the annual 8th grade Washington DC trip, making wonderful memories for students that they would never forget. That's what she always does and was always her goal was just to make for all students. She will be sorely missed in the middle school.

As you know, much of the decisions have been and likely will be out of our hands as far as local decisions on what school will look like in the fall. We'll continue to follow guidance and take direction from the Governor and New York State Department of Health, the CDC, and the Erie County Department of Health but there's a lot of task force and committees starting to form. I and our team are actively involved in those and we're going to do everything within our power to create a system, create a program that meets the needs of our students and aligns itself with what best practices are moving forward come the beginning of September.
