

Pocola Public Schools COVID 19 School Procedures

# **Daily Screening**

Students and staff entering school buildings are required to complete a checklist for safety guidelines each day and may be asked to produce the checklist if contact tracing is necessary. Pocola Schools highly recommends that parents/guardians perform a temperature check before leaving for school. PPS will administer temperature checks before starting the 1<sup>st</sup> class of the day.

1. Does your child have a temperature of 100 degrees or more today?
2. Does your child have a sore throat?
 3. Does your child have close contact with a positive COVID case?

#### **Isolation Procedure**

- 1. A student who exhibits a fever of 100 degrees will be immediately isolated in a predetermined room, a parent/guardian will be contacted and the student will be sent home. The student will be identified in a Google form for necessary staff to communicate with health officials.
- 2. Students or staff members who have been sent home due to temperature must remain out of school until fever free with no fever reducing medication for at least 3 days after receiving a negative COVID-19 test or 10 days if no COVID testing is done. During this time the student will become a distance learner according to district procedures. Daily off-site attendance will be taken through the digital platform.

# Classroom Strategies for Teachers

- 1. Students will wear a mask in the hallway or during passing periods, it is not mandatory but is highly recommended that teachers/staff use a covering for their personal health and safety
- 2. When available, maximize classroom space with one directional seating (unless classrooms have round tables)
- 3. Seating charts required for classrooms for all times during the class day.

- 4. Hand sanitizer and Clorox wipes for the desks will be available for the students. Hands will be washed and desks will be wiped down before every class.
- 5. Students with disabilities will have a plan developed and implemented focusing on health, safety and academics.
- 6. Mental health support will be provided for those who desire direction. All school personnel could be used in this role if needed.

## Blended Learning Requirements for Teachers

- 1. Teachers will reexamine classroom areas to maximize spacing of student desks/tables.
- 2. Seating charts for each period/class will be created and kept up-to-date.
- 3. Teachers will be expected to revert to distance learning as designed by their district when quarantine is required or when an educational plan is requested relating to health concerns.

## **Hallways**

- 1. To ease congestion in the hallway, students may carry their backpacks from class to class. If this solution becomes an issue, locker assignments will be reinstated.
- 2. When available one directional hallways can be utilized with a single enter/exit door.
- 3. During passing periods, students in grades 4<sup>th</sup> grade and up will wear masks in the hallways.

#### **Visitors**

- 1. Visitors are encourage to call the office before arriving on campus
- 2. Visitors will be limited to the foyer of each campus unless pre-screened and approved by the administrator.
- 3. Visitors will be strongly encouraged to wear a mask

#### **Bus Requirements for Safety**

- 1. Recommend alternate transportation, if possible.
- 2. Maximize the air flow of the bus by opening windows, if possible.
- 3. A seating chart will be emphasized with transporting students or athletes.
- 4. Masks will be worn on the bus by all students, unless health issues prevent.

#### Cafeteria Strategies

- 1. Wash hands or use sanitizer before and after eating
- 2. Organize students by class/grades when feasible
- 3. Create separate lunch periods when possible
