Uncertainty at Opening

Superintendent Bieber, along with the rest of the school, was uncertain about when and how they would reopen Alexander Public School. Ms. Bieber, along with the APS Health and Safety Reopening Team, used the state's "ND Smart Restart" guidelines to ensure a safe reopening for our building.

The ND Smart Restart guide provides certain requirements and guidelines to schools and businesses that are reopening following the coronavirus shutdowns. The school and Ms. Bieber also received input about opening school, via Zoom and inperson meetings, from staff, student leaders, parents, and community members.

The APS Health and Safety Reopening Team, comprised of numerous members of the Alexander community, put together a plan that received a thumbs-up from both the health department and the Alexander School Board.

The staff and students have to follow rules established in the reopening policy. These measures include disinfecting everything, tempo**Presley Powell and Colbie Rosco**

rarily limiting visitors, disinfecting buses everyday, encouraging hand washing among students and staff, and requiring everyone to stay home if sick.

The staff is also required to take and record their temperature daily upon entering the building in the morning. APS also formed a COVID-19 Team to deal with ongoing issues surrounding the virus.

Construction of the Alexander Industrial Arts building began in April of 2020, with a budget of 2.4 million. The APS School Board planned well, and saved several years' gross production tax dollars from the oil industry to fund construction of this long- awaited addition

to the Alexander School campus. The expected

time of completion for the shop is October of 2020. Shortly thereafter, classes are expected to start. All shop classes will be held in the new facility, but there will be other uses for the space, as well.

Part of the new building is going to be a bus bay, and will serve as a maintenance area.

This new addition is also affectionately known as "Nettie-topia," due to the enthusiasm of our Agriculture and Industrial Arts teacher, Ms. Nettie Johnson.

American artist Andy Warhol, most famous for his pop art, is this month's Artist of the Month.

This artist was born on August 6, 1928, and is said to be one of the most memorable and creative artists of his time.

Warhol made the design of the Campbell's soup can label an internationally recognized icon with one of his artworks. He also created other types of advertisement art and magazine illustrations. **

Andy Warhol was

a powerful force in 1960's and 70's counterculture and sometimes gifted his celebrity friends with original works of art. In 2017, rock legend Alice Cooper found a Warhol masterpiece, "rolled up in a tube" in a forgotten storage shed that the rock star had owned for years.* His original works are valuable to collectors the world over, and fetch high prices at art auctions.
