

The Fluor-BWXT Portsmouth (FBP), Diversity Council was started in 2017 and is designed to connect a diverse workforce to the business practices and the management at the Portsmouth Gaseous Division Plant and to promote Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) on the site and in the community. In an effort to promote a more diverse workforce, the FBP Diversity Council has created a scholarship for minority students in the local area who will be receiving further education at a trade school, technical college, community college, or university.

Applicants must be from a minority group including American Indian, Alaskan Native, Black, Hispanic (including persons of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, and Central or South American origin), Asian, or Pacific Islander. Applicants must also be accepted to a trade school, community college, or accredited college or university. The scholarships, each valued at \$2,000, will be awarded once to two area students.

ESSAY

The essay portion is an essential part of the FBP Diversity Council Minority Student Scholarship application and will be **strongly** considered in determining the scholarship recipients. This is your chance to show the Diversity Council who you are and why you deserve the FBP Diversity Council Minority Student Scholarship. The essay needs to be 500-1,000 words (or 2 to 4 paged double spaced with 12 point font) and written solely by the applicant.

Essays should cover the theme:

How has being a minority in an Appalachian county shaped who you are?

In responding to this theme, you may also want to include:

- o Why you should be selected to receive the FBP Diversity Council Minority Student Scholarship?
- O What your plans are while attending college or trade school?
- o What your future plans are upon graduation/completion?
- o Do you have financial need?
- o Are there any special circumstances that make you an ideal candidate for this scholarship?

- Transcript (with social security number blacked out)

All applications must be single sided with no staples
