Indiana High School Diploma Requirements (All students graduating BEFORE 2023 (current 10th-12th graders)

- ★ Core 40 Diploma (40 total credits)
 - 8 english credits, 6 math credits, 6 science credits, 6 social studies credits, 2 PE credits,
 1 health credit & 11 elective credits
- ★ Core 40 with Academic Honors Diploma (47 total credits)
 - Complete all Core 40 requirements PLUS the following:
 - 2 additional math credits, at least 6 world language credits, 2 fine arts credits, earn a C or better in all classes that count towards the diploma & a GPA of at least a 3.0
- ★ Core 40 with Technical Honors Diploma (47 total credits)
 - Complete all Core 40 requirements PLUS the following:
 - 6 credits in a college/career pathway, earn a C or better in all classes that counts toward the diploma, a GPA of at least 3.0 & complete ONE of the following: earn 4 credits in 2 AP courses & take the exams, earn 6 college credits in dual credit courses, earn 2 credits in 1 AP course & take the exam AND 3 college credits in dual credit course, earn a 1250 or higher on the SAT, earn a 26 or higher on the ACT, completing the written section or receive qualifying scores on the Accuplacer or Work Keys assessment.

Schoole may have additional local graduation requirements that apply to all students (not required for students with an ISP).

C.RE40 with Academic Honors

minimum 47 credits!

For the Core 40 with Academic Honors designation, students must:

- Complete all requirements for Core 40.
- Earn 2 additional Core 40 math credits.
- Earn 6-8 Core 40 world language credits
- (6 credits in one language or 4 credits each in two languages).
- Earn 2 Core 40 fine arts credits.
- . Earn a grade of a "C" or better in courses that will count toward the diploma.
- Have a grade point average of a "B" or better.
- . Complete one of the following:
 - A. Eam 4 credits in 2 or more AP courses and take corresponding AP exams
 - Earn 6 verifiable transcripted college credits in dual credit courses from the approved dual credit list.
 - C. Earn two of the following:
 - A minimum of 3 verifiable transcripted college credits from the approved dual credit list.
 - 2. 2 credits in AP courses and corresponding AP exams.
 - 3. 2 credits in IB standard level courses and corresponding IB exams.
 - D. Earn a composite score of 1250 or higher on the SAT and a minimum of 560 on math and 590 on the evidence based reading and writing section.**
 - E. Earn an ACT composite score of 26 or higher and complete written section
 - F. Earn 4 credits in IB courses and take corresponding IB exams.

C.RE40 with Technical Honors

ors (minimum 47 credits)

For the Core 40 with Technical Honors designation, students must:

- Complete all requirements for Core 40.
- Earn 6 credits in the college and career preparation courses in a state-approved College & Career Pathway and one of the following:
 - Pathway designated industry-based certification or credential, or
 - Pathway dual credits from the approved dual credit list resulting in 6 transcripted college credits
- Earn a grade of "C" or better in courses that will count toward the diploma.
- Have a grade point average of a "B" or better.
 Complete one of the following,
 - A. Any one of the options (A F) of the Core 40 with Academic Honors
 - B. Earn the following minimum scores on WorkKeys: Workplace Documents, Level 8; Applied Math, Level 8; and Graphic Literacy, Level 5.***
 - Earn the following minimum score(s) on Accuplacer: Writing 80, Reading 90, Math 75.
 - Earn the following minimum score(s) on Compass: Algebra 66 Writing 70, Reading 80.

Transcript Uses

Your high school transcript is your academic record of grades, courses taken, GPA, attendance and standardized test results. Transcripts are updated twice each year (at the end of each semester). You can NOT view your transcript on Harmony. You can request a copy of your transcript by contact the Guidance Department.

- * Your transcript is sent to colleges and each college reviews it differently.
 - *Curriculum: Core 40, THD, AHD
 - *Top half of class, Top 10%, Top 10
 - *GPA
 - *SAT/ACT Score
 - *World Language?
 - *Used for scholarship criteria
- *Required for Military (must have a HS Diploma)
- *Information used by employers
 - *Classes taken
 - *Attendance

STANDARDIZED TESTS

ISTEP+

- Must pass to graduate
- Offered twice a year
- Waiver based on Core 40 requirements, attendance, remediation, scores (growth), grades & teacher recommendation.

SAT

• Taken Junior and Senior years, critical reading/math, most common in Indiana, used with transcript for college admission & scholarships for 4-year colleges. Scholar Success Program for 21st Century Scholars.

ACT

 Taken Junior and Senior years, critical reading/math/science, most commonly used for colleges outside of Indiana, used with transcript for college admission & scholarships for 4-year colleges. Scholar Success Program requirement for 21st Century Scholars

ASVAB

- Need it to enlist in the military?
- Need to for Grad Pathways?

21st Century Scholars

- Determined by application 7th or 8th grade (by June 30th)
- Tuition paid to state schools (4 years)
- Can be used at public & private schools
- Must meet college admission standards
- Must remain drug, alcohol and crime free
- Must maintain a 2.5 GPA on a 4.0 scale
- Must earn AT LEAST a Core 40 Diploma
- Must complete Scholar Track program requirements
- Meeting September 2nd; virtual (make sure Chromebook is charged)
- > Fee waivers for SAT, ACT & college applications

21st Century Scholar Track Program Requirements

- 9th grade: Grad plan (4-year plan done in Indiana Career Explorer), extra-curricular activity or service activity & watch "Paying for College 101".
- 10th grade: Take a career interests assessment (done in Indiana Career Explorer), get workplace experience, estimate the costs of college.
- 11th grade: visit a college campus (9th grade ISU visit), take the SAT or ACT,
 & search for scholarships
- 12th grade: submit a college application, watch "College a FAFSA
- College Scholar Success Program

21st Century Scholars is NOT a North Putnam program, it is a State program. North Putnam serves as a resource for help, but scholars are ultimately responsible for all scholarship requirements.
