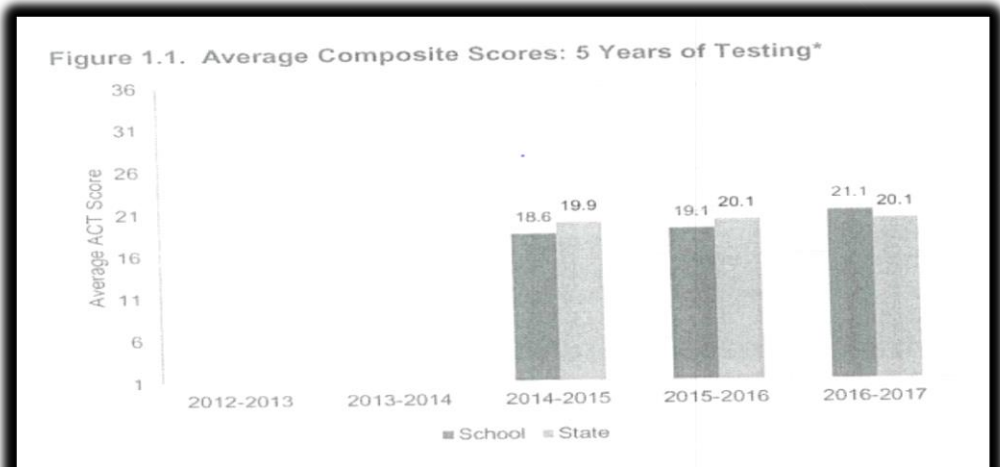

High School ACT Scores show Significant Improvement

As part of the Wisconsin Assessment System all students in grade 11 are required to take the ACT college readiness assessment. With the results recently published from last year's testing I wanted to share with you the fact that Mishicot High School showed significant improvement from the 2016 to 2017 school year. As the chart below shows, Mishicot juniors had an average composite score of 21.1 which is a 2 point increase over the previous year's score of 19.1. Additionally, our juniors scored one full point above the state average of 20.1 and have shown progress in each of the previous three years of testing. This significant increase in test results demonstrates the fact that Mishicot students are provided with high quality instruction at a rigorous level. Kudos to all of our staff in making this possible.

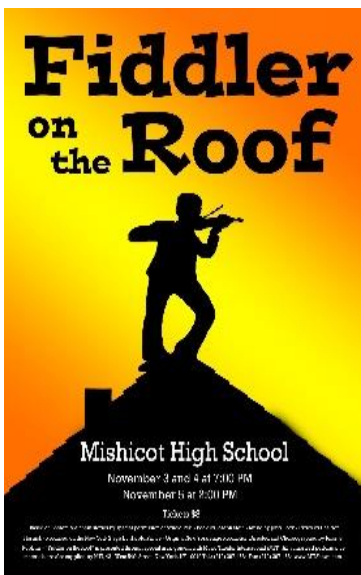
