1. Welcome & Call to Order Board Chair, Tom Blankenship called the meeting to order at 5:30 PM

2. Action Items

2.a. Lincoln County Athletics Return to Play Plan

Athletic Director, Tim Estes, led discussion on Lincoln County's Athletics Return to Play Plan. The Health Department approved the plan and said it meets all CDC guidelines.

3. Discussion Items

3.a. Possible Contract with Wilderness Trace Child Development Center

Superintendent Rowe discussed the services provided by Wilderness Trace. The same services would cost roughly \$200,000 if paid by the district. This is the same contract that has been executed between the two entities in previous years. It is in "draft" form as the window has not opened by KDE for WTCDC to submit its preschool contract services renewal application for 20-21. This typically occurs in the summer, but last year was delayed by KDE and approval was not received until September 25, 2019.

WTCDC has never charged more for services than the fees agreed upon per the contract, which is the KDE "per child allocation" received by each district based on the student's "primary disability" as indicated on the IEP.

Superintendent Rowe recommended the Board approve the contract.

3.b. Preschool to Patriot Committee Update

Exceptional Child Director, Ms. Claudia Godbey reviewed the results of the Preschool to Patriot Stakeholder (Community) and Staff survey results. Additionally, the Student Support Center checked households in Infinite Campus and identified 150 students who may qualify for preschool services. SSC staff and principals will be meeting with these families to see if they qualify and are interested in having their child attend preschool. Next steps are a PR campaign to better inform stakeholders of preschool registration.

3.c. School Re-Opening Plan

Currently, there are changes and updates to the recommendations sent from the Kentucky Department of Education on daily basis. Because of this, Lincoln County and many school districts are waiting until more information is available before making definitive plans for the upcoming school year. The Education Commissioner expects all schools to open by September 1 and as of now, Lincoln County schools hope to return as scheduled in August. The Superintendent will continue to monitor the situation and keep the Board up to date.

3.d. Alternate School Calendar Option(s)

All Kentucky schools are required to have a minimum of 170 instructional days and 1,062 hours of instruction. However, the Kentucky Department of Education allows school districts, who wish to implement a (Boat Dock) calendar in which school does not begin until the last week of August, to waive the 170 days as long as they meet the 1,062 hours. The Board was provided a sample of the Boat Dock calendar.

3.e. SRO Contract Options 1-3

Superintendent Rowe discussed the three options offered by the Stanford Police Department and the City of Stanford to provide School Resource Officers. As requested at the April School Board meeting the Stanford Police Department and City of Stanford offer the following options to provide School Resource Officers during the 2020-2021 School Year.

OPTION 1-CURRENT CONTRACT: Includes SRO full time at high school, and SRO to travel and cover Middle and elementary. Total Cost: \$59,804 or \$14,951 per quarter.

OPTION 2: Includes SRO full time at high school, and SRO full time at Middle School and SRO to travel and cover elementary Schools (2-3 days per week) Total Cost: \$73,000 or \$18,250 per quarter.

OPTION 3: Includes SRO full time at high school, and SRO full time at Middle School and SRO to travel and cover elementary Schools full time (5 days per week) Total Cost: \$83,000 or \$20,750 per quarter.

Superintendent Rowe recommended option three.

3.f. Extra Duty Pay for Certified and Classified Staff

With the possible approval of the "Lincoln County Athletics Return to Play Plan" coaches will begin working with student athletes. Currently only conditioning will be allowed.
