# **CURRICULUM COURSE OUTLINE**

Course Name(s): Concert Orchestra

Grade(s): **6-8** 

Department: Music

Course Length: 1 year, every day

Pre-requisite: **Beginning orchestra/director consent** 

Textbook/Key Resource: Materials provided by director

**Course Description:** Students review basic techniques for string instruments including note-reading, rhythm reading, and bowing technique, along with general vocabulary terms. Students learn more advanced techniques and grow in their musical knowledge and performance abilities.
