5.1 Revise 2020-21 Student Calendar (Resolution 090320-5.1)

Explanatory Statement: For the 2020-2021 school year, instructional hours requirements as split between days and hours per day has been modified, with increased time for staff professional development. With the shift in days, the students will still meet Division 22 standards for Instructional Hours for the school year.

As the school begins it journey into Comprehensive Distance Learning, equipment for students and preparatory time and/or trainings for staff must be as complete as possible prior to starting CDL.

Issue 1 – The Chromebook order to supply all students with individual device for distance learning is delayed in transit. The new estimated delivery date is September 9, 2020. Inventory can be completed and distribution for middle and high school students scheduled for 9/14 and 9/15.

Issue 2 – By shifting the first date of school by two days, this will allow staff additional preparation and/or professional development activities to be coordinated.
