# **Course Description:**

Students will explore a variety of health care careers in each of the five National Health Care Career Pathways (Therapeutic, Diagnostic, Health Informatics, Support Services and Biotechnology Research and Development). This class provides a unique program of leadership and personal development, basic medical knowledge, and direct learning from community members in the health field.
