## General Information:

Richmond-Burton is a single-school district serving the communities of Richmond, Spring Grove and Solon Mills. It is located roughly 65 miles northwest of Chicago on the Wisconsin border. The school year consists of four quarters in two semesters per year. Each school day consists of seven 45-minute class periods. Students in grades 9 through 11 are required to enroll in a minimum of 6 classes. Seniors enrolled in 5 classes and meeting graduation requirements may be eligible for early dismissal.

Honors Cords are awarded to seniors who earn an 8th semester cumulative G.P.A. of 3.25 or higher.

### Class Ranking:

The ranking of all students is based on the grade point average computed at the end of each semester. The Valedictorian will be determined by the following method:

1. The eighth semester ranking shall determine the Valedictorian and Salutatorian.
2. Ranking will be computed by dividing the number of grade points earned, by the number of credits attempted (GPA computation).
3. The grade point average will be carried three places beyond the decimal point.
4. If there are multiple Valedictorians, administrative discretion will determine the need for a Salutatorian.

**Note:** Only courses that earn grade points will be used in the ranking computation.
