Welcome to the 2020-2021 school year! While this year has begun like no other, we are excited to welcome each one of our students and families to the Lemoore Union Elementary School District. We have launched our year together in a virtual distance learning approach and we are dedicated to providing the best learning experience possible. All of our staff have worked diligently to prepare for this school year. We recognize that there are many changes this year; however, we are committed to providing an instructional model to best support our students' academic success, their social and emotional growth, and meet the needs of EACH ONE of our students.

We began our 2020-2021 school year with our meet and greet appointments. These interactions provided our teachers an opportunity to meet our students and provide them with their technology devices along with instructional materials. This is a huge celebration for our Lemoore families.

As part of our traditional Back to School time of year, we were excited to bring many of our families together through virtual Back to School Night events in place of annual evening events on campus. The virtual back to school events allowed our staff to meet our families and work together to share our learning expectations for the year. Our site staff have also been engaging in virtual parent engagement nights via zoom and will continue to find other ways to keep our students, staff and families connected.



ATTENDANCE MATTERS

Dear Families,

LUESD is making a concerted effort to ensure that all students continue to learn at high levels during distance learning. Attending school regularly helps students both academically and socially. Students feel better about school and themselves when they are engaged in their learning and remain connected to others. Attendance is the key to all of this.



Here are some tips to ensuring students are engaged in their learning every day.

- Establish routines Create regular routines for bedtime, waking up, eating and playing and establish rules for digital devices.
- Set up a learning space Dedicate a space for remote learning and studying. Keep the space clear from distractions during live sessions.
- Stay in touch Check google classroom every day for assignments and messages. Contact the teacher if you have questions or concerns.
- Check in with your children What are they learning about that day? What work do they need to complete?
- Follow the daily instructional schedule What time does your child need to log on? What time is he/she finished for the day? Utilize the teacher's office hours if your child needs additional help.

We want to express our gratitude for every family working diligently to make sure their children are logging on daily and on time, staying logged in throughout each and every daily session, actively participating in their learning and completing their assignments. You play a key role in making sure our students are learning and being successful.

Let us know how we can best support you and your children so that they are actively participating in their learning every day and throughout the day. We want your child to be successful in distance learning. Thank you for your efforts in supporting your child!

THE IMPORTANCE OF LITERACY

Literacy is the ability to read, speak, and write across a variety of contexts. Students constantly need to access new material through reading and then process that information by talking about it and writing about it to make sense of it.

Here are a few things you can do to support your child's literacy skills:

- Encourage Reading Reading is the first pillar of literacy. Encourage your children to immerse themselves in reading frequently. Online resources such as Sora (OverDrive) and/or Epic are resources that are readily available through the school. In addition, library books are still available to check out through the school's library.
- Discuss texts together Actively discussing what your children read encourages them to make
 connections and think deeply about the ideas contained in the text. Asking questions about the text and
 what it means to them as well as asking what it made your children learn and feel will provoke
 additional thought.
- Use activities that support literacy development Have your child:
 - Write a half-page story of a new or unusual word or phrase he/she read about
 - Summarize the plot of the book in his/her own words
 - Pick a new word he/she read and find as many rhyming words as you can together
 - Write a poem or a song using the new words or ideas from the book

TIPS TO SUPPORT YOUR STUDENTS DURING DISTANCE LEARNING INSTRUCTION



Take steps to protect children and others

- Make sure your children are up to date on well-child visits and immunizations.





After logging into Google Classroom, click the join button.


2 Stream


