**2020-2021 School Year Discussion**

Superintendent Skaggs stated the following:

1. The District is keeping up with questions that have been posted on Facebook after the release of the Restart Plan.
2. Per the survey most parents want students to start school in person.
3. Swivl video equipment is on backorder so the District purchased webcams for every teacher with the CARES act funding.
4. The District is finalizing the Quality Remote Education Plan at the Administration meeting that is following the Board meeting.

Lowell Perkins, Director of Support Services, updated the Board that the district has purchased and has in stock hand sanitizer and dispensers for every room and entrance, face masks and shields for students and teachers. The District has some Clorox 360 supplies and has ordered additional supplies but they are hard to get.

Kerry Shepherd, School Nurse, stated that she attended a meeting with other school nurses in the county with the County Health Department. The Health Department is giving all the schools a list of the symptoms to look for and what to do based on the number or type of symptoms. Any positive case that the District becomes aware of is to be reported to the Health Department. The County Health Department stated: water bottle fillers are permitted in place of water fountains, paper towels should be used in the rest room instead of air dryers.

Luke Nelson, Athletic Director, gave the following update: currently students are required to be tested for COVID 72 hours prior to competition, the stadium capacity at 20% is approximately 590, there may be a condensed fall sports season, and he is thankful for Final Forms.
