Hello students and families,

Welcome back to Kendall! Well, remote-learning Kendall that is! Both Ms. Rasmussen, and I, as well as the entire Kendall staff are excited to be back together again, even if it is virtually for the time being. The staff here would also like to extend our appreciation and utmost gratitude for the work families are doing to support this remote learning model. We know distance learning presents unique challenges and we thank you for your commitment!

I wanted to share with you what remote learning will look like this school year. After receiving feedback from students, families, and staff we have developed a plan that we feel will be as supportive of families possible while providing adequate rigor for all of our students. The Mount Baker **School District Family Handbook** describes what our distance learning model will look like.

In the above handbook, families can also find information about our instructional approaches for literacy and mathematics. Through the utilization of an online learning platform (Great Minds In Sync), students are able access instructional videos and materials in a time that best

fits their family's schedule. Additionally, teachers will host live learning sessions via Zoom to support the "Great Minds In Sync" lessons. (A quick note, if you're looking for specific staff Zoom Meeting Rooms, please visit this site.)

A quick note about what to expect from school-wide communications. Just like last year, either Ms. Rasmussen or myself will send messages on Sunday evenings at 5:00. In addition to these weekly communications, a digital form of the Kendall Connections will be sent the first Wednesday of every month.

We would like to remind you of the Mount Baker School District's continuing partnership with the Whatcom County Library System, called ConnectEd.
