- Fall Athletic Update – Eric Scott – Eric Scott will be in attendance to give an update on fall athletics. His presentation is in the materials.

Old Business

- COVID -19 Policies Vote – This is the second reading of these policies. I'm meeting with the Leadership Team on Thursday morning to review these policies. I will bring any feedback to the meeting on Thursday night. A vote is needed to approve the interim policies related to COVID-19.
- Full Day Kindergarten Tuition Reduction Vote – It is my recommendation to reduce the Kindergarten tuition by 50% as long as the district is in a hybrid or remote model. This will result in a loss of \$250,000 in revenue. We are confident that we can make up the difference with the 10% increase to Chapter 70. A vote is needed to approve the recommendation
