

CIS STUDENT ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA CHECKLIST School Year 2019-2020

CIS Eligibility Criteria

Texas Education Code, §29.081(d1-13 and g)

A student at risk of dropping out of school includes each student who is under 26 years of age, and who:

- Was not advanced from one grade level to the next for one or more school years. (Retained)
- If the student is in grade 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 or 12, did not maintain an average equivalent to 70 on a scale of 100 in two or more subjects in the foundation curriculum (Section 28.002) during a semester in the preceding or current school year, or is not maintaining such an average in two or more subjects in the foundation curriculum in the current semester. (Semester or course failure in two classes)
- Did not perform satisfactorily on an assessment instrument administered to the student under Subchapter B,
 Chapter 39, and who has not in the previous or current school year subsequently performed on that instrument
 at a level equal to at least 110 percent of the level of satisfactory performance on that instrument; (Did not
 meet assessment instrument standards)
- Is a student in pre-kindergarten, kindergarten, or grade one, two or three who did not perform satisfactorily on a readiness test or assessment instrument administered during the current school year. (Did not meet Readiness test Grade 3 or below)
- Is pregnant or is a parent.
- Has been placed in an **alternative education program** in accordance with Section 37.006 during the preceding or current school year.
- Has been expelled in accordance with Section 37.007 during the preceding or current school year.
- Is currently on parole, probation, deferred prosecution, or other conditional release; (Involved in Judicial system)
- Was previously reported through the Public Education Information Management System (PEIMS) to have dropped out of school. (Dropout)
- Is a student of Limited English Proficiency (LEP) as defined by Section 29.052.
- Is in the custody or care of the Department of Family and Protective Services or has, during the current school year, been referred to the department by a school official, officer of the juvenile court or law enforcement official.
- Is homeless as defined by 42 U.S.C. Section 11302 and its subsequent amendments.
- Resided in the preceding school year or resides in the current school year in a residential placement facility
 in the district, including a detention facility, substance abuse treatment facility, emergency shelter, psychiatric
 hospital, half-way house, cottage home operation, specialized child-care home, or general residential
 operation.
- Has been incarcerated or has a parent or guardian who has been incarcerated, within the lifetime of the student, in a penal institution as defined by Section 1.07, Penal Code.
- Student who satisfies local eligibility criteria adopted by the board of trustees of a school district by section TEC 29.081(g). – (Specify in comments section.)

Other Eligibility Criteria

- A student who exhibits delinquent conduct as defined by the Texas Family Code §51.03
- A student who is eligible for a free or reduced lunch
- · A student who is in family conflict or crisis
- Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) recipient
